female figure. In particular, I paint women who, for me, are unique in some way. I imagine these women to be edgy, gusty, glamorous and frequently whimsical. They are also bold, brave, sassy woman with fascinating lives. Women you don't meet every day. Who are these extraordinary women with lifestyles and personalities many of us secretly envy? For me they are those bewitching women who immediately stand out in a crowd. They entertain, shock and surprise us, and even make us wish we could be a little more like them. We can admire, loathe, love or pity them, but we can't ignore them. Ideas for my paintings have come from the real-life stories of famous women, but more often they are based on lifestyles I find intriguing: a madam in a wild west saloon, a dancer on Broadway, a stripper in a burlesque show, a hooker in a back-alley bordello, a willowy model walking the runway.



Whether I draw from my imagination or from live models, I use gesture, attitude, mood and costumes to create an engaging fantasy for the viewer. The medium watercolor, but gouache, graphite; charcoal, pen, pastel and collage are often incorporated as well. When paintings lead to a series, it's

particularly exciting because it provides the chance to do further study or maybe give me an opportunity to think about my own life. Ultimately I hope viewers will step inside the worlds of these women and find a way to connect emotionally, maybe with fascination, excitement, sympathy or amusement.

Karen McCauley will teach a workshop on WET IN WET techniques. Learn how to jump start your paintings by wetting paper and dropping in color using concentration of pigments for first values. She will cover composition and

Will present his Nocturne discussion and demo on Tuesday, April 18 at the Golden Hub. (He was sick last month.)



Talley's style of

impressionistic realism continues to evolve as he explores color from bold to tonal to nocturne. He takes artistic license to push a color or include a compositional element to accomplish his goal of creating the intangible "strong emotional content". Beginning as a portrait painter he has evolved to become primarily a western landscape painter. He also enjoys painting astronomical and religious themes.



Every summer, Steve travels from his home in Fredericksburg, Texas to his summer home in Taos, New Mexico. He has had a one-man show at the Museum of Western Art in Kerrville, Texas, the Taos Art Museum at Fechin House

and has exhibited at the Salmagundi Art Club in New York City. Talley also teaches landscape painting and is one of the authors of "Paint Fredericksburg, Texas: A Guide for Plein Air Painters".

"I will do a nocturne painting of an old adobe building; it will be an 11x14 and I will use Water Soluble Oils. I will also bring a large screen and computer to show some images of a painting by Frank Tenney Johnson that I've manipulated to show that the foreground and focal point of a painting could be either a daytime OR nighttime painting based on how one paints the sky. I will also show a few examples of other artists' nocturnes and how they differ from each other."



Local artists Barbara and Chuck Mauldin will be painting at Gallery 330 from 2-4 pm on Friday, April 7. Come by and see them depict the local landscape in oils.
