brokenness is the source of all great beauty... it's why I break my paintings.





"NOCTURNES IN THE AMERICAN WEST" INSTRUCTOR C.S. TALLEY

3 Day Workshop, May 8 - 10, 2025 • 9am - 4pm Museum of Western Art in Kerrville



The three day workshop taught by C.S. (Steve) Talley will center on painting Landscapes and Nocturnes of the American West. The West is known for its rugged, beautiful mountains and presents a great opportunity to learn about painting the artistic elements of landscapes and nocturnes in different kinds of lighting. Each morning Talley will begin with a one hour demonstration in oil pertinent to the day's lessons and students will paint thereafter. Talley will give individual assistance to all students throughout the day. Each day will conclude with a critique of the student's works.

Students will receive a materials list at registration. The MOWA and the instructor will not provide painting supplies. Students are asked to bring their own photo references of landscapes and nocturnes of the American West.

Additionally, Talley will have available reference photos suitable for the day's session. The class is open to all levels of painting experience. Oil or Acrylic is the preferred medium. Class size is limited to 12. The cost is \$375 per student and daily lunch is provided.

table easel or your standalone easel to the class. This will protect the floors and tables from any spills. Todd's workshops are open to all skill levels and all medias, He will personally will demo in oils, but his approach to teaching can be applied to all mediums.

- The examination of Finding Your Inner Voice; will be explored in squinting, design, value control, color control, edges, paint manipulation, variety/unity.
- Learn from the "Turn of the Century Masters" how to transform your paintings into Museum Quality - Works of Art!

<u>The typical first day</u> of the workshop starts with slide show presentation and studying several turn of the century masters work in the morning. This is followed by a painting demonstration in the afternoon where he will demonstrate and discuss his step by step process for painting a landscape from photos. <u>The second day</u> each student will start their own painting following the seven step method demonstrated. Todd will work with each student individually to assist them understanding and utilizing his process. <u>On the third day</u>, Todd will again do a demonstration, but this time he will paint only the first step and stop. The students will also paint the first step on their canvases and stop;

then Todd will paint the second step and so on. Each student follows along in the same fashion with Todd demonstrating each step and then stopping to let the students catch up on their own painting. The workshop will end with a final group critique
