the illustrative plates of every kind of bird and beast, and practiced drawing them over and over again.



Paula graduated with an MA in literature from the University of Houston at Clear Lake. She first began her career as an English and Humanities teacher and for a time, art took a

backseat. When she and her husband, Roger moved to Kenai, Alaska, Paula began searching for a way to distract herself from the long, dark Alaskan winters. That's when she discovered watercolor, promptly falling head over heels in love with this expressive medium.

Paula's paintings are colorful and varied, ranging from the delicate to the bold as she celebrates the unique personalities of her subjects. Her art encourages you to look closely at her paintings. If you do, you'll



find the eyes of Paula's animals looking back; a provoking reminder they are watching us too. Her abstracts are created to evoke strong emotions with their compelling combinations of color.

### FREDERICKSBURG THEATER COMPANY Spring 2024

Hi, DK artists! Please consider this a call for DK artists who would like to participate in our Spring lobby display and sale at the Fredericksburg Theater Company. The wall of art will go up on Tuesday, February 6 at 1 pm, and be taken down on Tuesday, May 7 at 1 pm. The display will encompass the following Broadway shows: the musical comedy "How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying", a comedy called "Sweet Delilah Swim Club", and the Fredericksburg Theater Academy selection, a junior musical, "James and the Giant Peach." FTC audience members only have a short while to see your work, so bring your most eye catching work.

This show is open to all DK artists. However, we are only able to accommodate the first 18 artists who respond to my personal email to bring ONE original painting. It's okay to have shown the artwork at FTC before, but please think also about new work.

The price for wall hung art must be \$100 or

more. Previous art sales have varied in subject matter and technique, from oils to pen and ink with watercolor. Popular subject matter includes animal, landscape, floral, and still life paintings. No collages, abstracts or photographs, please. Only image sizes of  $16 \times 20$  and below are allowed so more DK artists can participate. Sales of  $8\times10$  and  $11\times14$  paintings have worked better. We have only had one sale that ever exceeded \$600.

Unframed original artwork is no longer shown, as the long periods between shows creates a storage problem. Rather than replacing a work if you sell it, we had luck last summer with big SOLD signs in their place to generate excitement.

FTC handles any sales transaction, subtracts 25% for their administrative commission, and sends you a check! Please respond to my personal email address, <u>dlafferty@austin.rr.com</u> to indicate your interest in participating. I will email you back to let you know the status of the size of the artist group and whether we can accommodate all who wish to participate. Please let me know what size painting you wish to bring. THINK SPRING COLORS AND THEMES, and do what you do best.

Keep those brushes wet, pencils sharpened, pastels ready, and ink flowing......You get the idea!
