The King of the Western Pulp Illustrators A.R. Mitchell

The Museum of Western Art at 1550 Bandera Highway in Kerrville, Texas is hosting a special show of art by A.R. Mitchell. It will be up until April 18, 2026 in the side galleries (Kieckhefer and Egloff Galleries). It is on loan from the museum in Trinidad, Colorado. The show includes sketches and studies, as well as large paintings that were used to illustrate western fiction. There are numerous plein air paintings as well. You can view his palettes, his plein air rig, and more. It is worth a trip to Kerrville! Also enjoy pieces from the Permanent Collection in the Main Gallery.



Art DVD Collection by Don Fraser

There are over 200 DVDs in the Die Kunstler (DK) collection. The collection covers a wide variety of categories: Oil, Acrylic, Watercolor, Abstract, Charcoal, Graphite, and Drawing. The DK DVD collection is underutilized by DK members. I will highlight two (2) DVDs from the collection in each DK Newsletter. Let's start by asking a few questions:

- Why should I watch a DVD that is 5, 10, 20 years old? The DK DVD collection has a wonderful collection of master artists with decades of teaching experience in a variety of mediums.
- DVDs are old technology. Why use a DVD when I can stream the content to my iPad or laptop? Streaming may be more convenient but the vast majority of the content in the DK DVD library is not available via streaming. Some artists offer consumers the option of buying DVDs or streaming. Artists often use YouTube to promote their DVDs and books. Do your homework and see what is available. Personally, I utilize DVDs, streaming (YouTube), lectures, books and seminars to learn different techniques.
- I don't have a DVD player! DVD players are inexpensive. They can be hooked up to your laptop, desktop computer and your TV. Cost should not be a factor.
- I am a new (newish) artist. Just learning and do not have a preferred medium. For a new/newish artist, the DK DVD collection offers the opportunity to test drive a new medium before you go to Jerry's Artarama or Blick's to buy expensive sets of one or more mediums. Utilize the DVD library and then further your education with a DK mentor and/or 2 or 3 day seminar from a regional or nationally recognized artist.
- I know what I want to paint in my medium of choice? Why change? Many artists have a medium of choice but choose to experiment with other mediums e.g. oils and watercolor; acrylic and watercolor; graphite and charcoal. It is fun to learn the in/outs of different mediums.

Advice on How to Select 1 or 2 DVDs at the monthly DK Meetings

Carol Seminara (DK Board Member) is the DK Librarian. Ask her to send you a list of DVDs in the collection. The spreadsheet lists the artist, the title of the DVD, and the medium. Scan the list to search for the medium (e.g. watercolor) and then identify subject titles of interest. Do a Google search e.g. Quang Ho and artist and YouTube. I use this approach to evaluate the teaching style of the artist.

“Nuts & Bolts” is a two volume DVD set that was published in 2009. Quang Ho is an exceptional artist and teacher. He covers a variety of topics: Drawing, Visual Tools (line, shape, value, color, texture and edges), Tools & Materials, Understanding Tones /Values, Using Color, The Visual Approaches/Concepts, Equalization, Dark & Light Pattern, Light & Shadow, Shading vs Light & Shadow, Local Tone Painting, and Setting Up A Local Tone Situation.

If you were fortunate to attend the Quang Ho and Scott Christensen exhibit in 2024 at the Museum of Western Art in Kerrville you saw one of the best art exhibitions in the USA. DVDs from both artists are in our DK DVD collection.

Suggestion – take the time to absorb the instructions from a master artist. I wrote 19 pages of notes so have a pen and notepad on hand.

If you are new to watercolor painting and want a good basic review of what is involved then this DVD accomplishes the task.

Suggestion: do a Google search for: Ian Stewart Artist YouTube. Watch a few of his YouTube Videos to evaluate his teaching style. This video covers the basics of watercolor. Other DVDs by this artist include – “Light & Color” and “High Level Sketching.” In addition, do a Google search for: Ian Stewart Artist Books. Note. In addition to the aforementioned DVD, our DVD collection also includes “High Level Sketching” by Ian Stewart.
