THE FOUR TYPES OF ART CRITICISM You can:

Describe – Like being a good listener who mirrors back what the other person says. You can say. "I see see you painted a high horizon line and left quite a bit of empty space in the foreground…" **Analyze** – Like describing, but also discussing the interaction of different parts, e.g. "I think the small sliver of sky on top of all that foreground creates tension with that narrow strip of gray in the middle ground…"


Ask Questions / Interpret e.g., "This is about what the work is *doing* – e.g. "For me, making that stormy sky so narrow at the top gives the whole painting a mysterious, ominous mood. What was your thinking behind adding the hot-pink dolphin?" Evaluate – Here's where you give value judgments and/or brainstorm a fix for any perceived weaknesses, e.g. "I love the deep green you used here," or "I don't think the garden gnome standing in the middle of that secluded wildflower field is working ... maybe we can do something to make it less distracting ... what if you moved it the side ... or what if you just took it out?"

<u>Combine</u> – Analyze, Describe, Evaluate, Ask Questions, e.g. "I feel myself getting lost in this section... What if you adjusted the value or simplified this particular shape right here....? Here are some guidelines for giving (and getting) constructive criticism:

Make it a conversation Good criticism is a twoway street. It's best approached collaboratively. Aim to provide (and ask for!) *actionable* feedback Identify and brainstorm solutions rather than problems. Use "I" Be specific, not vague. Ask questions instead of making imperious pronouncements

Taming the Critic

These are all things you can ask your "critic" to give you too. You can say, "Be specific." You can ask for actionable criticism, as in "How would you fix it?" You can learn a lot about your work and how others see it by asking someone to describe it to you! You can say, "Describe for me what you see – tell me what catches your attention. For example, where does your eye go first, then second?



1. Have you paid your dues? You need to be a member to show in the Fall Show in November.

2. Start now on painting or drawing for the show, so you aren't rushed at the last minute to have something

ready for the show.

3. Be familiar with originality guidelines.

4. Check the website for last year's prospectus to get an idea about sizes and number of paintings allowed.

5. Find appropriate frames for your paintings now, not a few days before the paintings need to be hung.

What: 3-Day Workshop with Artist Cheri Christensen. Cheri is a hill country resident, represented by Insight Gallery.

Workshop Dates:

Workshop Mediums: Oil painters preferred. Cheri will also open the workshop to acrylic painters but they need to be skilled in mixing and handling their paints.

Workshop Description: Painting Light - Oil painting in the Russian Impressionist Tradition, which can be beginner (never painted before) to any level. This workshop will focus on creating a painting with the relative use of color, value, temperature and intensity. First, Cheri will go over the basics of this approach while doing a value study. Beginners will start with the still life, more advanced students may start with photos. Using the previous knowledge on value, students will then continue working with color, with an emphasis on color hue, temperature and intensity. Cheri will discuss choice of subject, light, composition, and edges to create the kind of painting one has in mind. Students may choose any subject matter they wish.

**** Note**: This will be a workshop about painting light. While Cheri likes to paint animals that will not be the focus of the workshop. Cheri will work with each student one on one. The focus will be to help increase the skill level of each artist with a tried-and-true way to paint... separating light and shadow no matter the subject.
