This will be my last newsletter article as your pastor. My last Sunday will be June 1st. Our time together is much shorter than I anticipated. Whenever I'm faced with the unexpected, I try to remember all that is constant in my life.

The people who love us. Yes, it's true that our time with loved ones is limited and often shorter than we want. But there is something loving about the custodial link of family and friends who continue to hold and care for us over time. I have a green stole that was quilted together as a graduation gift from seminary. It is made up of green squares, each representing a person who was a part of my life at the time. One hundred and twenty-five families and individuals contributed a square of fabric to the stole. Hundreds and hundreds of individuals could be added to it today. So many people, over time, had a hand in the person and pastor I have become.

A few years ago, I had a deeply moving spiritual experience serving communion. A 90-year-old member of the congregation came forward to receive communion. It was like any other communion Sunday. But this time, as I placed the bread in her hands, I thought about all the pastors before me who stood in my place. And then I thought about all the pastors who will follow me. I am one in a long succession of pastors who had and will minister and care for her. What an honor!

God loves us. Revelation 1:8 says, "'I am the Alpha and the Omega', says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." God is always with us and promises never to abandon us. What a comfort to know that it is the same God who called to us from our mother's womb, who was in the waters of our baptism, who celebrated our accomplishments, who visited us with friends and family in times of grief and pain and who will hold us as we pass from glory to glory. God is faithful through it all.

Hope is a constant throughout our lives. Without hope we would surely perish and wallow in despair. Hope gets us out of bed in the morning. Hope is what allows us to rest at night. Hope calls us to take risks and to imagine a better world. We all have difficult days, days when we doubt and have little hope. But the love of God and the church calls us to never give up. To keep going!

And so I have faith that no matter how unsettling the world is, no matter how unpredictable life can be, no matter how uncertain the future looks God will get us through. It has been a blessing to minister to each of you and to be ministered to by you. Your commitment to First Lutheran Church encourages me every day. And your care and concern for one another strengthens my faith.

I believe it is important to say a proper good-bye. I will be intentional about saying goodbye to each of you. I welcome opportunities to gather for food or activities or simply to exchange goodbyes after worship. And while I can't come back to minister with you, I will be taking the

memories of our time together with me as I move to Hinsdale United Methodist Church, in Hinsdale, IL.

Due to the closing of the Dosker Manor Housing Complex, we are expecting a drop in customers coming to our food pantry. We did not see that in January and February, but there was a significant decrease in March. We have discontinued giving eggs due to their rising cost and being told that we can no longer subdivide a package and give 6 per customer. We have been purchasing packages of margarine instead, when funds are available.

Everyone continues to have a good time and enjoy the camaraderie behind the scenes at the pantry. It is very gratifying to be showing God's love with our labors.

The Food Pantry currently has about \$600.00 We average 209 customers per month.

We appreciate all donations and especially your clean, used grocery bags.

Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners, and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord, for nothing **profane** or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made **clean**, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from <u>Caesarea</u>, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the gentiles the repentance that leads to life."
