A Letter from the President

"Dear friends at First Lutheran Church:

Last month, Jay and I were visiting Bethany in New Zealand. We have traveled up and down the coast and seen many interesting plants, birds and beautiful scenery. New Zealand is a lovely place.

During our trip, we were in Christchurch, New Zealand. About 15 years ago they were hit by a devastating earthquake. The main cathedral of the city was destroyed. The community of the cathedral built a "transitional cathedral".

This has become known as the cardboard cathedral. From the outside, it appears to be a huge triangle when you enter you are in an open space with chairs and a huge vaulted ceiling all created by the cardboard tubes construction workers use to cast concrete. Everything, railings. The Cross in front and chairs are made either of cardboard or plywood. The side supports appear to be train storage cars that have been painted white.

From devastation, the people of Christchurch created an unique, interesting and beautiful worship space. The city is filled with stories of people working together after the earthquake to rebuild. I can only hope and pray that in Louisville, we would do as well if another disaster such as tornado struck us again. It is certainly a goal to strive for — to have that type of community.

Music Ministry

Sunday, the day we remember those who have passed away in the past year. They are now memories in our hearts and minds. We sing the beloved hymn *For All the Saints* (ELW 422). We also remember our baptism which brings us the promise of life eternal after our earthly life ends. The liturgical color of the parametrs changes to white, the color of light, innocence, purity, joy, triumph, and glory.

Then we have the final two Sundays in the Time after Pentecost. The liturgical color of the paraments returns to green, used for its symbolism of our growth in faith as we follow the teachings and ministry of Christ.

November continues with Christ the King Sunday, the day we celebrate Christ not as a king on the earth, but as an eternal king bringing life everlasting. It is also the last day of the Christian Year or Liturgical Year. On this day we celebrate the all-embracing authority of Christ as King and Lord of the cosmos. The loving and merciful and just King of the universe is praised and glorified. The liturgical color of the paraments returns to white.

November ends with the First Sunday of Advent, the beginning of the Liturgical Year. The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival". It is a season marked by a spirit of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing. The liturgical color of the parametrs now changes to blue, a color suggesting hope.

A Word from the Worship and Music Committee

Lay Readers

In a continued effort to implement ideas brought up in our <u>strategic planning process</u>, we are continuing to use lay readers in the worship service. In the Lutheran tradition, liturgy is the work of the people. Using lay readers involves the people of the congregation in that work on a weekly basis. We appreciate those who have volunteered to read, and look forward to their continued participation as we rotate lay readers. Gospel Procession

God's word comes to life in the people. We, the assembled, are the ones who carry the word into the world in lives of justice and peace. In a response to our <u>strategic planning process</u> we have added a gospel procession to our liturgy. During the gospel acclamation, leaders carry the cross, candles (sometimes), and book from their places at the pulpit and come to a designated spot among the assembly, down a center aisle or at the middle of

the room. There, the gospel is read. Then the procession returns. This movement adds drama and visual diversity, as well as bringing home the idea that the word is planted in us for a harvest of mercy and justice. (Adapted from *Sundays and Seasons* online.)
