## Message from the Pastor

By now you are aware that my time at First Lutheran is limited. It was my hope to stay for several years and create with you a more sustainable First Lutheran Church. I do think sustainability is possible. And I'm happy to contribute to it the best I can over the next year. It's still possible because success does not depend on one person. It depends on all of us.

A great example of this is the famous story of scientist Francis Galton. In 1906 he found himself walking through a village fair that included, among many things, a contest. The villagers were invited to guess the weight of an ox on display. 800 villagers ventured a guess. No one guessed the weight exactly, 1,198 pounds. After it was over Francis asked if he could collect all the guesses. He was interested in averaging them out. And wouldn't you know it. The average equaled 1,197 pounds!

For years, scientists have recreated this experiment proving its validity. Collectively, a group of people knows the right answer. When it comes to knowing what's really real, groups can function as a sort of collective intelligence.

Paul understood this idea. In 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 Paul goes through a long description of the "body" of Christ. While Paul acknowledges the importance of each part of the "body", what is paramount for Paul is that the body requires everyone to work together. Paul picks up this idea again in Romans 12:4-8. He states that even though we may be individuals, we desperately need each other to survive.

These stories have stuck with me for a long time. I've incorporated them into my discernment practices. Whenever I'm trying to figure out what to do, I identify five people to talk to. I find that by asking 5 people what they think I should do, I'm somehow able decide. It's not a foolproof technique, but I find the practice extraordinarily useful. It brings clarity out of confusion.

I think it's the same for congregations. I've watched churches discern a vision for the future by relying on the pastor to come up with a plan. While the vision may be inspiring and plausible, it often falls short. It lacks the wisdom and knowledge of the group that is necessary to solve the problem at hand.

So, whenever I lead a vision process, I always provide ample opportunity for the congregation to talk to each other. It's important to talk about our hopes and dreams for the future, our fears about the uncertainty of life and the importance of having God walk with us. Out of these efforts can come robust and vibrant visions for a congregation that move beyond surviving to thriving.

As First Lutheran Church begins to consider where God is calling us to go in the coming years, I hope you will join me in these conversations. Our future will be discerned not by me, or by you, but by all of us, collectively deciding where it is God is calling us to go.

So, let's go!

## Prepare in a Year <br>  <br> Prepare to be separated from your loved ones

Fill out an out-of-area contact card for each household member to keep in a wallet, purse or backpack at all times. If you are separated from your loved ones in the event of disaster, your first thoughts will be about your family, their location and if they are safe. The stress of the event may make it hard to remember even routine information.

## Out-of-area contacts

Ask an out-of-area friend or relative to be your contact person. This person should live at least 100 miles away from you. They can send messages to your family in the affected area and then reply back to you. An out-of-area contact is the key piece of a great communications plan. Especially since the internet and cell phone signals may be sparse following a major event. You may be able to send text messages to your loved ones on your cell phone. Keep these messages short.

## Use the Web

Research Emergency Apps. The American Red Cross has an Emergency app that lets you link your contacts and send a safety message, as well as a place you can register yourself as "safe and well." Facebook also has a "safety check" that can be implemented after a disaster.

## Official Sources

Register with your local alert system. Find out how officials will communicate with you. The Red Cross Emergency app will also send weather alerts.

Print out a card
for every member of your household and
fill in all information. Carry card to reference in the event of a disaster or other emergency.
