Pastor's Message

When I was growing up, my high school youth group used to take a choir tour during spring break. We would travel to different destination points. I can't remember all of them, but New York City was one that comes to mind. Along the way there and back we would perform for congregations and they would house us for the night. There were roughly 80 youth involved.

One of the musicals performed in years prior to my high school years was "Celebrate Life", written by Buryl Red and Ragan Courtney. Throughout the musical there is a song that repeats with the words: After this he [Jesus] went journeying / From town to town and village to village / Proclaiming the good news of the Kingdom / The Kingdom of God.

Often in the scriptures during Lent, we hear stories of Jesus on the move: journeying from village to village, proclaiming the good news. This is in stark contrast to what the church has been teaching for several decades: build it and they will come.

Christianity is no longer just in a decline. According to recent surveys, Christianity is headed towards extinction in the next couple of decades. The challenge that Christianity is facing is how to engage the "nones." These are people who are religious but have "no" religious affiliation. They don't belong to a particular denomination or church.

It seems to me that if we are to connect and engage with our neighbors, we will need to rethink church. Particularly, we will need to rethink how we share the good news of Christ. Will we fortress in place within the confines of a building that feels a bit daunting to enter for the first time? Or will we find ways to move out into the community and build relationships with our neighbors and neighborhoods?


And, just in case you were wondering ... no one has the answer to this problem. We are definitely in a trial-and-error time of history. I've spent most of the last decade trying to fully comprehend the paradigm shift we are experiencing and experimenting with different ideas. The experiments involve finding ways to build relationships with people while taking into consideration the reasons people give for leaving the church and becoming "nones."

Church members often fear that we will get rid of what they hold dear. We certainly don't want to throw out the baby with the bathwater (which is such a curious phrase. Who does that?!) But we do have to find ways to live in the tension that we find ourselves in.

What does it look like to be better connected to our neighborhood and community (to get outside of our church building) and still retain our identity and mission as a congregation? This is a good question for meditation, bible study, conversation and praxis. I look forward to hearing your ideas.

May your Lenten practices and this congregation continue to be a blessing to you on your faith journey towards Easter and the fulfillment of God's love for all of creation. I am grateful for the ways each of you continue to be a blessing to me.



Then those who went ahead and those who <u>followed</u> were shouting,

"Hosanna!

<u>Blessed</u> is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming <u>kingdom</u> of our <u>ancestor</u> David! <u>Hosanna</u> in the highest heaven!"

Then he entered <u>Jerusalem</u> and went into the <u>temple</u>, and when he had looked around at <u>everything</u>, as it was already <u>late</u>, he went out to Bethany with the <u>twelve</u>.
