Honoring the past...creating a new beginning.

Dear Friends,

Having failed to get any of our plans concerning our 150thanniversary celebration printed in *The Friendly Visitor* newsletter, we apologetically are providing those plans here.

A year-long celebration occurred when First Lutheran celebrated her 100th anniversary. Fifty years later things have changed! With a smaller congregation, a different financial situation, a gap in pastoral leadership, and emergence from a global pandemic, we have made a conscious decision to begin our celebration on Anniversary Sunday, June 5, 2022, which is also Pentecost Sunday. We are honored to welcome the Bishop Bill Gafkjen, of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod, that day preaching and presiding in worship. A catered luncheon will follow the service. An organ music festival is being organized, featuring local organists. Later on, a larger "homecoming" celebration featuring an open house and reception will be held. This celebration will include a montage of vintage photographs, a display of historic church directories, and congratulatory letters and notes containing memories. In addition, mini tours of the sanctuary will be offered, featuring commentary on the historic stained glass windows, as well as an explanation of the symbolism of the Last Supper altar carving.Invited guests will include former pastors, music directors, and members of First Lutheran, their families, and members of the public.

Nola Lillie has done an exceptional job discovering historical bulletins and newsletters, which she has been distributing every two weeks to the congregation. Sharon Lillie is researching and updating events that have occurred over the past 20 years (since our 130th anniversary) to bring our history up to date.

We are asking you to share special memories and personal stories and anecdotes of your years at First Lutheran. What brought you here? What keeps you here? What do you consider important to share with others about your experience at First Lutheran? These memories will be collected and included in a commemorative volume for all to share, as well as included in a time capsule. Please be thinking of appropriate items to be secured in a time capsule, so that they may be shared with generations in the future, giving them a glimpse into First Lutheran in the first half of the 21st century.

The dedicated and creative team members of the 150th Anniversary Committee are Larry Askins, Nola Lillie, David McNease, Drew Wartschlager, and Lexi Wartschlager. We are excited to share this historic anniversary with you.

Please join us as we honor the past, and help us create a new beginning.

Exodus 12:1-4,11-14

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it.

This is how you shall eat it: your loins **girded**, your **sandals** on your feet, and your **staff** in your hand; and you shall eat it **hurriedly**. It is the **passover** of the LORD. For I will pass through the land of **Egypt** that night, and I will strike down every **firstborn** in the land of Egypt, both human beings and **animals**; on all the **gods** of Egypt I will execute **judgments**: I am the LORD. The **blood** shall be a **sign** for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no **plague** shall destroy you when I **strike** the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of **remembrance** for you. You shall **celebrate** it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your **generations** you shall observe it as a **perpetual** ordinance.
