Message from the President

Dear friends,

Often when Vicky and I are working in the office, there will come a knock at the door or a ring of the bell. It is rarely the technician we are waiting on. Usually it is someone living on the streets, asking for a snack bag, which we call a 24-hour bag. In these bags we have items that come from the USDA portion of our food allotment such as walnuts and raisins plus random, easily opened items from the Kroger barrel. We use money donated to the pantry to round it out with a bottle of water and perhaps a granola bar. Everyone is polite, and almost everyone says thank you.

But some that come to our door are, how shall I say? More colorful characters? Many years ago I met on the sidewalk a man who introduced himself as St. Anonymous of Butchertown. Dressed in a bathrobe and carrying a staff, he announced that he would bless our building. I told him okay and he did this, from the sidewalk. I have never seen him since.

Once or twice a week, someone will come down the sidewalk angry, talking, yelling, gesticulating, obviously beset by something from the inside of their mind. Mostly they keep going on down the street, but some have stopped. The diseases that attack the mind corrupt the very system intended to get them help.

The cameras show us that some come late at night and sit on the bench in front of the statue of Jesus and pray, or just talk. One young man has come twice in the last few weeks, asking for a pencil and something to write on. When this has been given, he has sat on the bench, writing over and over, asking for prayers. He has put these papers in the mailbox, and he may also be the person who puts loose change in the mailbox. There's no way of knowing. We can't decipher what he writes because he overlaps letters. The most we can make out is that he wants prayers for his mother.

So after you have said your prayers, please put in one more. Please pray for all those struggling with mental illness and for their family members, for strength and care in the months to come.

I will set up <u>over</u> them one shepherd, my <u>servant</u> David, and he shall feed them; he shall <u>feed</u> them and be their <u>shepherd</u>. And I the LORD will be their God, and my servant <u>David</u> shall be <u>prince</u> among them; I the LORD have spoken.
