We <u>ourselves</u> heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain.

We also have the <u>prophetic</u> message as something completely <u>reliable</u>, and you will do well to pay <u>attention</u> to it, as to a light <u>shining</u> in a <u>dark</u> place, until the day dawns and the <u>morning</u> star rises in your <u>hearts</u>. Above all, you must <u>understand</u> that no prophecy of <u>Scripture</u> came about by the prophet's own <u>interpretation</u> of things. For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were <u>carried</u> along by the Holy Spirit.
