For most of January, we are in the season after Epiphany – the climax of the Advent/Christmas season. The season after Epiphany actually extends from January 6, the day of Epiphany, to Ash Wednesday, which begins the season of Lent leading to Easter. The term *epiphany* means an appearance or manifestation, especially of a deity. In the Western church, Epiphany is celebrated as a commemoration of the manifestation of Christ, especially to the Magi, and also at his baptism and at the wedding feast of Cana. The ELCA lists the principal themes of the season as the revelation of Christ to all nations, Jesus' baptism in the River Jordan, Christ as the light of the world, the public ministry of Jesus (including Jesus' first miracle of turning water into wine at the wedding at Cana), growth in a Christian's baptized identity. The season's gospel readings focus on numerous events in the early life and ministry of Jesus. Look ahead and consider how the stories in these readings prepare and inform us as they lead us into the next season of the Church Year, the season of Lent.

John 1:29-42

The next day he saw <u>Jesus</u> coming toward him and <u>declared</u>, "Here is the <u>Lamb</u> of God who takes away the sin of the <u>world</u>! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him, but I came <u>baptizing</u> with water for this <u>reason</u>, that he might be <u>revealed</u> to Israel." And John <u>testified</u>, "I saw the <u>Spirit</u> descending from <u>heaven</u> like a <u>dove</u>, and it remained on him. I <u>myself</u> did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with <u>water</u> said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit <u>descend</u> and remain is the one who baptizes with the <u>Holy</u> Spirit.' And I myself have <u>seen</u> and have testified that this is the <u>Chosen</u> One."

The next day <u>John</u> again was standing with two of his <u>disciples</u>, and as he watched Jesus walk by he <u>exclaimed</u>, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples <u>heard</u> him say this, and they <u>followed</u> Jesus. When Jesus <u>turned</u> and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you <u>looking</u> for?" They said to him, "<u>Rabbi</u>" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you <u>staying</u>?" He said to them, "<u>Come</u> and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they <u>remained</u> with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the <u>afternoon</u>. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was <u>Andrew</u>, Simon Peter's <u>brother</u>. He first found his brother <u>Simon</u> and said to him, "We have found the <u>Messiah</u>" (which is translated <u>Anointed</u>). He <u>brought</u> Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called <u>Cephas</u>" (which is translated Peter).
