He said, "**Legion**," for many demons had entered him. They begged him not to order them to go back into the **abyss**.

Now there on the <u>hillside</u> a large herd of swine was <u>feeding</u>, and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them <u>permission</u>. Then the demons came out of the man and <u>entered</u> the swine, and the herd <u>stampeded</u> down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.

Then people came out to see what had <u>happened</u>, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. Then the whole <u>throng</u> of people of the <u>surrounding</u> region of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them, for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone out begged that he might be with him, but Jesus <u>sent</u> him away, saying, "Return to your home, and <u>declare</u> how much God has done for you." So he went away, <u>proclaiming</u> throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.
