




This is How I Do IT!

Two tips today!

Everyone carves trying to make their project look great. But since you are looking at it so long as you carve it, you almost can't see the issues...the carving looks great! Trust me there are always issues! Once you have a carving completed...set it aside and don't look at it for 3+ days, maybe even a week. Pick it up and guess what, you will see problems that you didn't see before...clean it up and you will have a great carving. It's a great way to effectively critique your own work. This is how I do it!

[Dean's Tip: Take a picture of you carving and then look at the picture. You'll be surprised what you find. And keep a small detail knife close to your paint table.]

Amanda, a relatively new carver but not a club member, showed me a pumpkin (one we did in the demonstrations) that she used glow in the dark paint on the pumpkin eyes, nose and mouth. When you shut off the lights...it looks like there is a candle in the pumpkin. A unique addition to your demonstration project. take a look at the Pumpkin and paint. This is how Amanda does it!
