



2025 Show Update

 WOW, less than three (3) months until the club show. Show will be held Sat & Sun, 4 & 5 Oct, at the Sevierville Senior Center; same place as last year's show. We're going to need lots of volunteers to help out again, but more on that later.

TRAINING

- Training will be held both BEFORE & AFTER the show. First training sessions will be Wed-Fri, 1-3 Oct, before the show; 2nd session will be Mon-Thu. 6-9 Oct, after the show.
- Gary Falin's 3-day caricature carving class held before the show is full; however, we have a 'wait-list' you can get on.
- Here's a list of the other training classes that will be offered BEFORE the show"
 - Richard Holden, Caricature. 2 days, Thu-Fri, 2-3 Oct. Cost: \$100
- Ed Lampert, Christmas ornament from Bark. 1or 2 days, 2-3 Oct. Cost: \$60 for 1day; \$100 for both days.
- Linda Feagan, Pyrography. 3 days, 1-3 Oct. Cost: \$150 [project piece included or bring your own]
- AFTER the show we'll have:
- Richard Wetherbee: 2 days, 6-7 Oct, Clay; 2 days, 8-9 Oct, Bark, Roughouts, Realistic or Caricature [just about anything you want to carve]. You can take a class for 1 day. Cost: \$75/day

SHOW Volunteers

The show isn't a success without your help. And to encourage your participation, we will once again have a "Participation" prize drawing. The prize this year is a NEW Helvie knife.

Here's how the raffle works. For each activity you volunteer for AND do, you get a raffle ticket. Here's a list of the activities:

Club Projects

Please bring your finished demonstration projects to display at the show. This will show folk what we do as members and hopefully, encourage new members. To encourage participation, JR is going to hold a special raffle. You'll get a raffle ticket for each carving displayed; no cost to display. Winner receives a carving from JR or wood for carving....your choice!

Club Demonstrations

JR, who normally leads the monthly demonstrations, couldn't be at the July meeting so Chet & Dean volunteered to step in. The July demonstration was their take on Ddalo's "Simple Hillbilly" fridge magnet.

To speed up the carving, we started off with 1.5x1.5x4" blocks cut on the diagonal. This gave us roughly the same dimensions as Ddalo who starts with a 100x50x20mm block and cuts the sides to form a triangle.

To make the carving look more "Hillbilly-ish" Chet added the corn cob pipe and a patch on the hat. He also demonstrated his technique of pushing the hat brim back and adding a "swooping" cut just above the edge. This really makes the hat look like it's sitting

on the nose. Chet also changed the mustache, using Bruce Ankeny's technique to enhance the smile. Picture to the right is Chet's carving.

Here a list of the demonstrations scheduled for the rest of 2025. NOTE, this schedule is EXTREMELY flexible. If you have ideas for demonstrations, let JR know as soon as possible.

Carl Rosser brought in his flower relief carving and Maria D'Elio displayed some of the monthly club projects she's finished. Way to go Maria!









This is how I to do it!

Fed up with not being able to draw symmetric faces? Have a lot of carving gifts you want to be the same and need to get done in a short time? Well, here's my secret: 3D printed stencils. These stencils help layout carvings with clean crisp symmetrical lines that are repeatable from carving to carving.

The artist/carver who creates these stencils is Angel Nunez; he's on Facebook. He's designed more the two dozen stencils and has video tutorials on how to use/carve them on YouTube. You can buy the stencils via the Etsy link below:
