A Brief History of The Presbyterian House

The Presbyterian Association of Chautauqua, New York has been active since 1883.

The construction of the Presbyterian House, the first brick building on the grounds, was begun in 1889, expanded in 1908 and designated an Historical Site in 1987 by the Philadelphia

Presbyterian Historical Society. In 1927, the Mary Willis House was willed to the Association by Mrs. O. G. Franks and occupied until 2004, when the house was sold.

To meet the need for more affordable housing, a process was begun in 1999 to expand the existing Presbyterian House. A hospitable environment, in which a multigenerational group of people could

experience Chautauqua was the goal. The expanded Presbyterian House was completed and opened in June 2004. The Mary Willis House Wing is part of this expanded facility.

Guest charges are kept to a minimum through contributions to the Association from faithful members and friends. No support is received from any board of the Presbyterian Church.

The Stephen Phillips Scholarship Fund

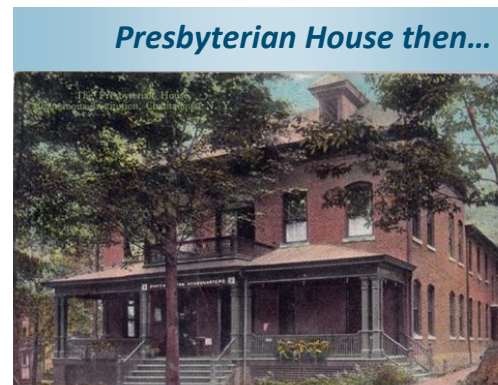

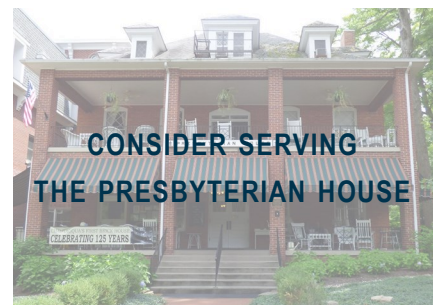

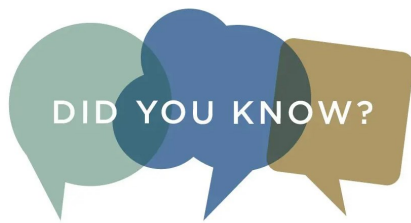

Q: What was the very first brick building built on the grounds of Chautauqua?

A: Built in 1889, the Presbyterian House was the first brick building on the Chautauqua grounds.

This fact is questionable. 🤔

Q: What year was the Presbyterian House updated?

A: 2004. When the addition was built, it was the most energy efficient building in all western New York, and the Presbyterian Association received a very large grant as a result.

Q: Who is Isabella Macdonald Alden?

A: Isabella MacDonald Alden, author of the Pansy books (“*Four Girls at Chautauqua*,” etc.), raised and donated money for the original house. The books are said to have given an important impetus to the success of Chautauqua in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Isabella also turned over the first shovel of dirt at the dedication of the house.

Q: What can one hear sitting on the porch?

A: Morning worship, the 10:45a.m. lectures, orchestra rehearsals and concerts, Sunday morning service, the Sunday afternoon concerts, the Sacred Song services.

Q: What helps the Presbyterian House keep their rates reasonable year-after-year?

A: Contributions to the House are used to keep our rates reasonable for all guests.

Q: What society has recognized the Presbyterian House as a Presbyterian and Reformed Historical Site?

A: The Presbyterian Historical Society



Chautauqua Trivia

The Chautauqua Literary and Scientific Circle (CLSC), founded in 1878 by Methodist Bishop John Heyl Vincent, is one of America's oldest continuously operating book clubs. It was founded to promote self-learning and study, particularly among those unable to attend institutions of higher learning. Over 8,400 people enrolled the first year.

With the success of its program of planned reading, book selections and local circles, the CLSC became a prototype for book clubs, study groups, and university extension courses. Reading Circles multiplied around the country and by the turn of the century, over 10,000 circles had been formed.

Each summer, the CLSC chooses at least nine books of literary quality and invites the authors to Chautauqua present their work to an audience of approximately 1,000 readers.
