Presbyterian House Building and Grounds

We had a mild winter, but as the building and its systems age, lots of stuff to keep up with. There was a sprinkler leak problem in the lower staff area, a hidden pipe leak in the wall between the restrooms on the ground floor, boiler failures in the penthouse and other failures in the building controls area. Hopefully, the dry wall work to patch up the holes that were made in order to repair the leaks will be completed before we open.

This was the first year in a while that we did not have any capital projects done in the building.

Inside, the dining room chairs have been refinished. New cushions for most of the wicker furniture located around PH have been delivered. They are really colorful so you will notice them!

Twenty-two bricks have been ordered for the memorial walk and will be installed this season.

Landscape Beautification at Presbyterian House

To improve the west-side area of the PH we added a dimension to our outdoor space and replaced the original patio with new pavers and an updated look. Last year as a result of the new design of the Amp, we inherited an opportunity to add some beautiful new flowering plants.


