Section 3: Verses 16-17	Paul declares the gospel as the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes. Closing Prayer: Close with a prayer of thanksgiving for the faithfulness of fellow believers, for the gifts of the Spirit, and for God's power to work through us as we grow together in faith.
