# <u>EDUCATION – Fly Fishing Silver Creek Arizona</u>

Looking for a place to fish for large trout that is not too far away and is warmer than it is in Flagstaff? Try Silver Creek. It can be done, there and back in a long day or you can stay over in Show Low for a night.

Silver Creek is a clear, spring creek that is stocked with some huge, trophy size rainbow trout and the state of Arizona's fish, the Apache Trout. The stream is stocked from the Silver Creek Hatchery located upstream Silver Creek. Brood stock from the hatchery is also stocked on occasions. These trout may be as large as 25 inches. This stream is located near Show Low, in the White Mountains. It is "catch and release" only and barbless hooks are required from October 1 through March 31.

The stream is at a high elevation and approximately two miles long. It has plenty of undercut banks but also some pool, runs and riffles. The Arizona Game and Fish Department owns the land.

Silver Creek is very silty and ranges from difficult to impossible to wade. The stream can be fished from the banks. The stream meanders back and forth through open meadows.

Many anglers are not aware that the native Apache trout is Arizona's state fish. It is listed under the Endangered Species Act, but anglers can fish for it in some waters. Silver Creek is one of them along with the Little Colorado River in the Greer Valley and the East and West Forks of Black River. The White Mountains of Arizona is the only place in the World where you can fish for the pure strain Apache trout.

Apache trout may become the first native fish in the United States to come off the endangered species list. This is all due to the excellent efforts made by the White Mountain Apache tribe, the Arizona Game and Fish Department, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and many angling organizations. Silver Creek Hatchery is located east of Show Low about 5 miles on Highway 60. Turn north off 60 onto Bourdon Ranch Road for five miles to Hatchery Way Road. Turn east on Hatchery Way Road for 1/2 mile to the facility.
