Think of a favorite color, think of your least favorite color. What is your favorite quilting technique, least favorite activity when quilting, This is not a competitive challenge!

Program

Modern Quilting with Patricia Cone

Kay Dwyer introduced Patricia whom she met in Blowing Rock, NC. Her passion with fabric started in 8th grade Home Ec classes. She went on to a degree in clothing and fabric design, and later, Psychology, and a Biblical Counseling. Her specialty is Dahlia quilts, but she forays in quilting, clothing, and other textiles.

Kaffe Fassett is her favorite designer of quilting fabric; her favorite artist Matisse. AND she loves riding horses.

When Patricia's niece was getting married she asked for a red and white quilt. Over several years, her niece changed her requested colors and designs. She eventually settled on a modern quilt that she calls "Sunset."

Kathryn Lyle, owner of Mountain Threads in Blowing Rock, taught an improv class.

She once purchased a roll of Ralph Lauren fabric from Wamsutta and still has most of the roll.

Her latest experiment is a "Mountain Quilt" with angled top edges that make the quilt look like a mountain range. Some of the modern quilters who are on Instagram include Victoria Findley Wolfe, Zen Chic – Brigitte Heitland, Quiltachusettes – Heather Black, Curated Quilts, Art Gallery Fabrics, Anna Maria Horner, Kaffe Fassett, Denyse Schmidt, Gees Bend.

Characteristics of a Modern Quilt

Often, there are no borders, piping, binding. Bold use of color, high contrast and graphic areas of color, improvisational piecing, expansive negative space, alternate grid work, minimalism or maximalism, big stitching.

Traditional Quilts reimaged are moving into Modern Quilting where a traditional block is adjusted in size or shape, fabric choice with solids or negative space, have a non-square edge shape, insertion of improv piecing into traditional block portions.

Facing on a quilt involves 2.5" strips and big squares folded diagonally to cover the corners where the strip ends do not join together. See YouTube video.

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Bio—"My passion for fabric and design began in home economics in the 8th grade. After getting a degree in Fashion Design in 1973 my focus in the 70's and 80's was clothing design, I had a custom clothing business with a dear friend in Palm Beach for 10 years. I went back to school for a BA in psychology then a graduate degree in Seminary in Biblical Counseling in Amish in Indiana, so discovered quilting, As a therapist for 34 years in south Florida and now in Boone, NC, I have continued to design and make quilts, as well as teach classes on machine appliqué, pillow making, the giant Dahlia quilt and Big Stitch hand quilting." (And she rides horses too!!!)
