the newsletter may refer to that of two months prior due to newsletter deadlines. The current balance is \$19,074.16. \$422.92 was paid to Amanda Truett for Quilts of Valor expenses, bringing the QOV balance to \$692.66.

OLD BUSINESS

- 1. Nancy Garchek reported that the Pizza Girls recent sale for Western North Carolina relief was very successful!
- 2. QUILT SHOW, Shelley Thompson. Kay Dwyer's lanyard instructions were emailed to guild members. Kay has a roll of the vinyl used in the making of the lanyards, and Shelley has pre-cut pieces of the vinyl available. Fall-themed lanyards from a previous show may be used, but members are encouraged to make new ones using spring fabrics and to bring them to meetings for show and tell.

Catherine Caswell said that there will be a lanyard workshop at the June 23 evening Sit and Sew. Other workshop/demos will be held on the fourth Thursday evening of each month.

Guild members, including new members, are asked to create a 15" finished and bound block for the design wall display at the quilt show. Be sure to include your name on the front. The blocks will be hung at eye level at the show this time, so please do your best work. It was suggested that the **Birthday month challenge** quilts due for this year's June joint meeting could be made to fit the size requirement of

15" and used for both purposes; however, names on the front would need to be added after the challenge presentation.

There will be a sale of Raffle Quilt tickets at the SALT Block on April 12. Members can get an envelope of 24 tickets to sell from Sherry Huffman

Shelley will host a Zoom meeting for quilt show committee chairs each month, generally the Monday evening of the same week as regular guild meetings.

3. LANCASTER TRIP: Reservations are still being taken. Please sign up as soon as possible in order for organizers to get an accurate count. Call Dawn Cole or Cathy Starnes with any questions.

New Business

- 1. Project Linus Day will be held at Mt. Hebron Lutheran Church in Hildebran on April 26.
- 2. The Original Sewing and Quit EXPO will be held in Raleigh on May 1-3. There are six free admission tickets available (three for the morning guild meeting and three for the evening guild meeting attendees).
- 3. The Family Guidance Center in Caldwell County currently handles clients from Catawba County. They are accepting quilts and pillowcases, same sizes as before. Dawn Cole has volunteered to deliver the donations from the guild to the Lenoir location.
