MINUTES, MORNING MEETING, SEPTEMBER 11, 2025

CALL TO ORDER—WELCOME

President Nancy Garchek called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Total attendance: 47, including one visitor, Jenny Hoover, and two new members, Kathy Wilson and Diane Amos.

A moment of silence was held in memory of 9/11/2001.

SUNSHINE & SHADOWS

- Jan Carpenter reported that her sister Pat Carson is undergoing medical tests.
- Health concern for Dawn Barbersek's mother, a former guild member, was shared by Sherry Huffman.
- Tonya Hodge's step-grandson just received his honorable discharge from the military.
- Ann Becker is celebrating her son-in-law's remission from cancer.

Door Prizes

Dotty Williams won for attendance and Dianne Johnston won for wearing her homemade name tag.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES & TREASURER'S REPORT

Jickie Crocker moved to accept the August minutes, and Kandi Peterson seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as written.

Treasurer Joyce Gates reported a guild balance of \$22,247.47. The total so far in the Libby Sigmon Memorial Fund is \$620. Chris Appenzeller announced that after conferring with Libby's two daughters-in-law and several of her friends, it was decided that the money be used towards having quilt design professional Susan Edmonson speak at the guild morning and evening programs on July 9, 2026, and lead a workshop on Saturday, July 11. Libby especially loved making quilts with bird motifs and taking classes from Susan, so the theme of the workshop project will have something to do with birds. Contributions to Libby's fund, a designated line item in the guild budget, are still being accepted and will be collected by Joyce.

QUILT SHOW

1. Lily Boutique: Catherine Caswell said that the next evening Sit and Show workshop will be held on

September 25, the fourth Thursday of the month, and it will be a non-sewing project. She asked that members hold onto their completed Lily Boutique items until after the holidays.

- 2. Raffle Tickets: Sherry Huffman reported that the guild was unable to sell tickets at the recent American Legion fair. She will look into the following possible sites suggested at the meeting: Hart Square's Fall Festival and the Murray's Mill Fall Festival.
- 3. Judging: Barb Mahnke announced that Scott Murkin will again serve as judge but then someone new will be contracted for the following show. He will speak at the November program. There will be room at the show for over 260 quilts. Barb encouraged members to show their quilts even if they'd prefer not to have them judged. There should be no limit to the number of quilts submitted to the show, but members should give them a priority ranking just in case there is a limit in the time allowed for judging. The quilts will be stored at Barb's home between judging and show dates. Categories will be similar to those from the previous show. Detailed guidelines are to come. Quilts must have been made within the last three years, since the last show. Only members may enter quilts. Similar sized quilts will be grouped together.

Important Dates:

Pre-register about one month before turn-in dates of 3/20 and 3/21 at the church

- Judging: Friday, 3/27 and Saturday, 3/28 (Easter falls between judging and hanging dates)
- Hanging of quilts at Highland Rec Center: 4/16
- Show: 4/17 and 4/18

All quilts should have labels on the back. The labels must be covered by a fabric patch which is either safety pinned or LOOSELY stitched to the quilt.

4. Vendors: Kay Dwyer reported for the Vendors Committee. They are open to suggestions for vendors who could take the spots of any vendors who

may need to drop out. Sam, a vendor who sharpens scissors (and some other blades) will be available only on Friday at the show. So far, there are no button, yarn, or thread vendors. It is possible that additional 10' x 10' spaces may become available for additional vendors.

5. Food Trucks: The Highland Rec Center has a list of approved food trucks. It was suggested that liability insurance issues be considered.

OLD BUSINESS

Publicity Chair: Tina Downward, a new member who has volunteered to serve as the guild publicity chair, was introduced. Tina requested suggestions for contact names.

December Quilt Challenge: Terrie Townsend said there will be a workshop on the fusible grid technique on October 11, 9:30 – 2. Cost is \$10. Location is in the "night meeting room." CALL TO ORDER—WELCOME

The CVQG Board unanimously voted to buy the 320 drapes needed for the quilt show. We will still rent the coverings for the tables and the pipes. Michelle Macy will store them at her house.

Update on the plans for the money donated in memory of Libby Sigmon: Libby's Lovely Ladies, who were a very close support group for Libby, and her daughters-in-law discussed the best use of the funds to represent Libby. The funds are going to sponsor a program and workshop by Susan Edmonson who was one of Libby's favorites and also represents her love of

birds. The program will be July 9, 2026 and the workshop will be July 11th. We also discussed hanging one of Libby's quilts in the April Quilt Show.

Door Prizes

Lisa Echerd won the door prize for attendance and Terrie Townsend won for her homemade name tag.

QUILT SHOW NEWS

Cathy Starnes has post cards for the quilt show and signs. She has also rented a billboard. The post cards have been dropped off at Bill's Sewing, Lee's Sewing, Cotton Quilts and Conover Quilts.

Joy Mease also gave an update. The paperwork and a picture of your quilt will need to be turned in in February and quilts will need to be turned in March 20 & 21. April 16th quilts will be hung at the show and the show itself will be April 17 & 18. There is room for 260 quilts. The vendors are getting lined up including Sam the scissor sharpening guy.

The next two mission days are Saturdays Sept. 20 and Oct. 18. These are from 9-3 and are held at the church. [Details on p. 1].
