Minutes July 8, 2021 – Joint Meeting

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting began at 6:04 pm with Debbie Swartzel welcoming all those in attendance.

Program

The program for the evening was moved to the beginning of the meeting to accommodate our speaker. Pat Carson introduced our guest, Ms. Patty Blanton. Pat opened by saying that Patty was kind and smart and had many interests in various crafts, but sewing is her passion. Her first quilt was a bi-centennial quilt to give an idea of how long Patty has been quilting. She retired from teaching high school physics after 42 years and now teaches classes at Sew Original in Boone, North Carolina.

The program consisted:

Decorative Stitch Art that you create on with your sewing machine. You can use the decorative stitches on the machine. Patti suggested that everyone take some bright thread and sew on black or white fabric a few inches of each stitch and keep it in a book for quick references on just what the stitch looks like when finished on the quilt top. (no stabilizer needed if batting in the center)

Thread Sketching is tracing design onto the fabric, then stitching over that area to make it more noticeable on the quilt top. She had several pieces to demonstrate this technique to the group. (thread weight 50 or 60)

Thread Painting is exactly what it sounds like. You use the thread to paint over sections of the quilt top to make it stand out even more. She had several bird panels where she added the thread to a bird to make it more 3D.

She also reminded us that painting requires 40 weight thread. Patty also recommended Terial Magic fabric stabilizer or cut away stabilizer to

prevent puckering of the quilt top as the method above will pull the fabric more than regular quilting.

I-quilt classes are offered online if interested at iquilt.com. End of Program

Hi All, Gigi and I are working hard on the 2022 quilt show and currently seeking estimates for our pipe and drape needs. We anticipate that the layout will be similar to our last show.

Kathleen Dukelow has come on board as Publicity Chairperson. She has working on some new and interesting ideas for advertising our show. I think these will lead to a great turnout to see our quilts.

We are going to sell quilt raffle tickets for the Winter Village quilt at two Hickory Farmers Market dates: August 21 and Sept 18. We have volunteers signed up to help with both dates.

We also plan to sell raffle tickets at the Hickory American Legion Fair (Sept 1-6) and still need volunteers to sell tickets for Thurs and Fri Sept 2 and 3, 5–9 pm; Sat Sept 4 2:30 – 9 pm; Sun Sept 5 2-5 pm, and Mon Sept 6 12-9 pm. Shifts are 2 to 2 ½ hours and we'd like two persons for each time slot. Please let Mary Bucy (mbucy1@gmail.com) know when you can work. Also, remember to write your name on tickets you sell; if you sell the winning ticket you will receive \$100.

The American Legion would like us to support their fair by entering items to be shown. Their premium book is not out just yet, but I expect it soon. In the booklet, there are entry forms and the dates you would bring your items to be entered as well as picked up. Premiums awarded usually range from 2-10\$. 
Two Requests From Our Website


