MINUTES NOVEMBER 11, 2021 EVENING MEETING

PROGRAM

Mary Bucy introduced the speaker for the program: Ms. Linda Johnson from Morganton. Linda was born in Asheville, was married at 18 to her husband of 52 years. They met their first year in college. They have 3 grown sons and 4 grandchildren. She first learned to sew by making clothes. Her mom introduced her to quilting. Linda's program for the evening was "how to make quilted postcards". She has been making these postcards since 2008. Her methods and projects have been published in magazines over the years. She has donated postcards to the Cancer Center in Memphis and children's hospitals in the area. She also sells these postcards on Etsy if you are interested in purchasing one online.

The program consisted of detailed instructions beginning to end on how to make the postcards. Kits were available for purchase. There are several instructional videos on the YouTube channel. She uses a Size 12 needle in her projects. She recommended Faultless Iron Cleaner to clean any residue from your iron, Aileen's Glue and Peltex (hard interfacing). She used satin stitches around the edges or other decorative stitches.

Bonnie Gold designed it and coordinated its construction; it has the additional value of being probably the last quilt Rebecca Mullins did for our guild prior to her move.

Kathleen distributed packets of raffle tickets plus a color picture of the quilt to members; this will occur also at our combined evening meeting on December 09. We will use the December meeting as a kick-off to our 2022 Quilt Show: Kathleen Dukelow will have bookmarks and postcards for us to distribute as advertising materials.

Committee Heads Still needed: a person to chair the Demonstrations Committee and a person to chair the Hanging Up and Taking Down the Quilts Committee.

PROGRAM

Mary Bucy introduced Nancy Johnson. Nancy began sewing doll clothes at age 9 and went on to make much larger items before getting interested in quilted postcards. She notes that they are creative and different and have the happy advantage of being small and thus quick to finish; when you're doing a postcard, your ironing board is the perfect size for a design place. She began her Etsy shop about 2007; look for her website at www.sewupscale.etsy.com. Nancy gave everyone a detailed handout of the steps to making a quilted postcard and then showed the assembly steps. Her special suggestions included using a pressing cloth, changing your sewing machine needle often, using Faultless Iron Cleaner to remove gunk from your iron's soleplate and her preference for Sulky thread. She brought both completed postcards and postcard kits for sale.
