During his military career, his permanent duty station was Boston, but he spent most of his time in the Coast Guard traveling throughout the Caribbean, assigned to duties such as illegal immigration, and intercepting illegal drugs and arms shipments. The quilt Todd chose was made and quilted by guild member Rob Ford.

This past Monday, Veterans Day, the guild held a ceremony at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church to present 25 Quilts of Valor made by members to military veterans, including Todd's father Tony Beatty.

An invitation was received from the Ashe County PieceMakers Guild. CVQG is one of 10-12 guilds invited to participate in their Invitational Guild Challenge, July 24-25, 2020.

The rules include that only one quilt may be entered by CVQC, and it must have been made after January 1, 2015; cannot have won an award at any national quilt show; can be any type of construction; etc. The challenge to CVQG will be deciding which one quilt to enter. It is planned as a viewer's choice competition, with ribbons and cash awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. Award checks will go to the winning guilds, not the quilt makers. During March-April 2020, CVQG must send them information on the single quilt entry and its maker. Last week, the Board discussed a possible plan to determine the guild's single entry. Details will be shared following further discussion.
