#### Service Projects

Mary Long visited both hospitals in December. Frye had no need; Catawba hospital, 10; pillowcases and quilts were also given to the Child Advocacy Center. Three preemie quilts are being held for Frye hospital per request of the quilter. FYI: Sizes of quilts are noted in the 2019 directory/handbook.

Elle Clemens mentioned that My Carolina Home and Campfire are requesting quilts for victims of the California fires. If a twin or double quilt top and backing are donated, they will find a long arm quilter to do the quilting.

Next Mission day will be February  $2^{nd}$ , 9-3 in our old room.

The 15 inch blocks from quilt show were ready to take residence with their creators, and were on the back table.

## New Business

A quilt retreat is planned April 21<sup>st</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> at Camp Holston.

Kay Dwyer is looking for volunteers to keep the quilt show process in high gear. They will focus on these areas: location of quilt show, review of what worked and did not, etc. Meetings will be monthly and information and thoughts will be presented to the guild to decide. Please let Kay know if you are interested.

A motion was made by Kandi Peterson to approve the budget, Gere Helton seconded. Motion passed.


#### **Other Business**

# MINUTES EVENING MEETING JANUARY 10, 2019

## CALL TO ORDER

President Mary Long called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm and welcomed everyone. There were 20 members present and six visitors, including former member Lisa Bartholomew, former member Susan Torchia who recently returned to Hickory, and Lorane Rohr, Mary Duquette, Kim Ledford and Tammy Gillespie.

## Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the December meeting were printed in the January newsletter. No changes or additions were stated. Amanda Truett moved, seconded by Peggy McCosh, to approve the minutes as written. The motion carried.

## Financials

The guild's detailed financial report from December was printed in the January newsletter.

## Announcements

• Jan Carpenter will now handle membership for the evening group.

• The <u>2019 member handbook</u> will be distributed in February. Debbie Abernethy is printing the handbooks, and needs all corrections to the member directory ASAP.

• Mary Long asked for an evening group volunteer for the <u>2018 Audit Committee</u>, and Susan Bisulca volunteered. Susan will meet with Treasurer Teena McRary, board representative Joy Mease, and morning representative Mary Bucy to review last year's financial records. Their results will be reported to membership in February.

• The <u>board meetings are held at 6:00 pm</u> on the first Thursday, not 6:30 pm as stated in the

#### recent newsletter.

• Mary Bucy said Chris Appenzeller has planned <u>the 2019 Challenge</u> for members, a "Journaling through Quilts" activity focused on self-expression, expanding one's comfort levels, and journaling. Chris will share the details in February. It will continue throughout 2019, with all challenge quilts displayed during the joint meeting in December. • The <u>Ouilting and Needle Art Extravaganza</u> will be held on January 25-26, at the Statesville Civic Center.

• The <u>morning meetings have moved</u> to Community Room A-B, the former Fellowship Hall. Evening meetings will remain in the regular room, and all joint meetings will be held upstairs.

## Quilts of Valor

Amanda Truett said the guild will present <u>a</u> <u>Quilt of Valor at Hickory Police Department</u> tomorrow at 4 pm, during police officer Mike Crisp's retirement ceremony. He served in the Army and Guard for 30 years, and the QOV ceremony is a surprise for him. She invited guild members to attend and participate.

Amanda said numerous <u>requests for a Quilt of</u> <u>Valor presentation</u> followed the quilt show in October, along with <u>15 other requests</u> from the National QOV Foundation. During the nearly four years the guild has participated in the program, <u>253 Quilts of Valor have been made by</u> <u>the guild and awarded</u> locally.

#### Guild Mailbox

This morning, Barbara Mahnke shared <u>a</u> <u>heartfelt thank-you note</u> received from a current member of the Kernersville Guild, whose daughter and son-in-law are foster parents. Two days before Thanksgiving a 15-day old preemie girl, born early and addicted to drugs, arrived at her daughter's home from a NICU in Hickory, complete with a beautiful quilt from CVQG, and she wrote to say how much they appreciated it.

## Service Projects

The local <u>Children's Advocacy Center</u> currently needs quilts for boys. Their clients range in age from babies to 18 years. The quilts should be kept on the mild side, with no depictions of war, etc.

This morning, information on <u>My Carolina</u> <u>Home</u> was shared. They are making quilts for people who lost their homes to recent NC hurricanes and California wildfires. If a guild member makes a quilt (including the backing) they will long arm the quilt and donate it. Contact guild member Elle Clemens at 828-606-9246, or refer to their website for more information.

At one time, Mary Long said members <u>could</u> designate the location where they wanted their service quilts sent, and they can still do so if they are adamant about it. She is currently delivering the pillowcases, preemie and sunshine quilts to Family Guidance Center, Children's Advocacy Center, Catawba Valley Medical Center, and Frye Regional Medical Center. The NICU census at Frye stays very low, and the past two times she visited they did not need any preemie quilts; however, the preemie census at Catawba is typically high, and they usually need them. If a member *only* wants their preemie quilts taken to Frye, they need to attach an instruction tag to each one and she will hold them at home until Frye needs them. No matter where quilts are delivered, Mary pins a label on it, saying it is from CVQG. A new cloth label is being designed for members to sew on and quilt over, which cannot be removed. Mary noted our guild is not the only organization delivering quilts or coverings to these organizations and hospitals.

## Ркодкам – Review of 2018 Year-end Budget & 2019 Proposed Budget

Mary Long introduced Treasurer Teena McRary who presented the program. Teena distributed copies of the 2018 actual year-end budget and 2019 proposed budget to everyone. She also provided interested members a copy of the detailed line item budget report from 2018, including every check written, every deposit made, etc. She discussed the 2018 income and expenses, and reviewed the 2019 proposed budget in detail. She said there will not be another quilt show until 2021, so the main source of income this year will be from membership dues.

Regarding the 2018 quilt show, the total income was \$30,914.46 and expenses were \$16, 669.47. Teena said the show was a huge success in many ways, including financially, with a profit of \$14,244.99. Thanks to Quilt Show Chair Kay Dwyer and all members who participated in the show! The full financial report from the quilt show was also provided to interested members.

Amanda Truett moved, seconded by Debbie Smith, to approve and adopt the 2019 proposed budget as presented and discussed. The motion carried unanimously.

Mary thanked Teena for the great work she does as Treasurer. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7:40 pm.
