Quilt of Valor discussion

Debbie Swartzel explained to the guild that donations made to the guild marked as a QOV donation can only be used to purchase supplies related to QOV projects. The monies cannot be used by the guild for any other purpose. Amanda Truett provided up to date records of all monies and expenditures relating to the QOV projects. Beginning in January 2023 with the new budget, Amanda will use all QOV donations first before using guild line-item budgeted monies. The newsletter will reflect this breakdown of "regular guild money" and "QOV money". Frances Allen, our treasurer, will make sure that financial spreadsheets presented to the guild will break down these categories.


