She adds: Here's another project I'm piddling with—making mega blocks mixing shirt fabric and other fabric in half square triangles. Goal is to up




-cycle some of the great checks and plaids in shirts.

HICKORY 150 QUILT UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who has made beautiful blocks for Hickory's 150th anniversary celebration. I know that all of us have had our lives upended in one way shape or form since we signed our blocks out.

However, too much work has gone into this by too many of us to abandon the project. So here's where things stand:

- At this time there is no timeline. We'll finish when we finish.
- While we're not under any time pressure, I'd prefer to not entirely stop working on it if possible.

My guess is that if you've checked out a block or blocks you are in one of four places:

- You've completed your block(s) and are ready to turn them in.
- You haven't completed your blocks but plan to when life settles down.
- You haven't completed your blocks and don't feel up to doing them.
- You've forgotten that you have blocks to do or lost your background or pattern.

Please know there is no judgement on my part no matter where you stand. If Covid-19 had a theme for me it's been grace. I've been trying to give it myself and others.

I've been listening to a lot of audio books while I'm sewing the last couple of years. One I listened to recently *Everything is Figureoutable*.

This is figureoutable.

So, consider this a check in. If you still have a block or blocks, I'd appreciate you letting me know where you stand on them.
