Quilts of Valor Mission Day: Saturday May 21, 9-3, bring personal items or work on QOV or other quilts for Family Guidance or Children's Advocacy Center.

QOV Presentation: May 17, 2022 at 11:00 p.m. at Hickory Police Department Training Center at 1 p.m., lunch served at 11:00 a.m. QOV has awarded 300,000 quilts so far. This is a big milestone. Our QOV program began in 2015. We have awarded 527 QOV so far. We have Vietnam Vet pins available for our QOV recipients who served in that conflict.

June 9, 2022 Semi-Annual Joint Meeting features display of the 2022 Stars Quilt Challenge, and a covered dish dinner. (Please bring a utensil to serve your food & remember to take it home!)

Program

Carl Stevens was introduced by Jan Carpenter. Mr. Stevens splits his time between Sparta, NC and Florida. He was originally from Flint, Michigan. He has been married 51 years to the same gal. He is an award-winning quilter! He gave us a trunk show of all his 12 wonderful quilts. Anymore than that is too many. 1-stack and whack, 2-Fons/Porter-2013 Mardi Gras quilt, 3-Endless Stars/ Rainbow Galaxy, 4-Lone Star Strips (honorable mention), 5-1st place-Rainbow Infinity, 6-Summer Solstice-hot piping-(lone Star), 7-Stars of Mardi gras, 8-Wheels and Gears (memory quilt for a friend), 9-2nd place-Lester's star (for this dog), 10-Crimson Poppy (Paper piecing), 11-Summertime/Kentucky Spirits, 12-Black Magic/Rainbow Magic

Two methods of Binding - Flange and Hot Piping

Flange – is all machine binding – you will need 2 strips of fabric – basic color 1.5 x WOF / Accent-1.75 by WOF – sew together, Note: make sure you have enough to go around the whole quilt. Press accent color to basic, fold in half (bad sides to bad sides). Accent will be 1/8 inch. Sew to back with accent facing you, then wrap to front. Make sure thread color matches. He suggested using clear or smoked thread in upper bobbin to match, then stitch in the ditch. Note: bottom thread should match the color of the back of the quilt.

Notes on Thread: smoked thread will go with 75% of all fabrics, use the white or clear for pastels. DO NOT use old thread, will break, so trash it before you get frustrated. Buy new the manufacturing is better now. Aurafil or Superior! Also you must use a 10, 9 or 8 needle because the thread is so thin and is very hard to thread in the needle but will work better and not break as easily in the smaller eye.

2nd method – Hot Piping – Susan Cleveland's – he explained it but it is more complicated than the first method. Not for a big quilt, it gets wobbly. Bigger / Wider is more colorful and the ticket for quilt show judges.

CATAWBA VALLEY QUILTERS GUILD—QUILTS OF VALOR ACCOUNT

Members of the Catawba Valley Quilters Guild and several local quilters have put forth so much time, effort, dedication, and emotion to support the Quilts Of Valor mission in our local communities. We did not imagine that in just seven years our quilters would have pieced, quilted, bound, and presented over 525 QOV to our local veterans to date! We also did not imagine that we would have such a great monetary and material support returned from the Veterans, Veteran organizations, and our own Guild Board and Guild Members.

Below are the year-to-year Receipts and Expenditures with the "Balance" line showing the annual positive or (negative) balance that is then carried into the "Annual Receipts" line for the next calendar year. We want our Guild members to be aware of these QOV funds since many of our members are so

actively involved in QOV.

The 2022 current balance shows the accumulation that is maintained exclusively for Quilts Of Valor and is not available in the Guild's General Funds even though the monthly statement does not show a specific line item or separation for the QOV funds. Tracking and acknowledgement of QOV receipts and expenditures locally (in our own Guild's account) is important because the donations received do not "belong" to the Guild—rather they "belong" to the Quilts Of Valor Foundation as per the QOVF bylaws. Since CVQG is a not-for-profit organization, we are allowed to maintain the QOV donations in our own account rather than send the donations to QOVF and request reimbursement from QOVF.
