OLD BUSINESS

The 2020 Guild Retreat will be held April 26 to May 1, 2020, at Camp Holston in Banner Elk, NC with lots of quilting and fellowship, great food, and various free time activities. Debra Rubin said 10 people are now signed up. The cost is \$300-325 per person for 5 nights, Sunday evening through Friday morning.

Terrie Townsend discussed the Embroidery Class that Rebecca Mullins will teach in her home. Information was e-mailed to members earlier. Anyone with an embroidery machine who wants to learn more about embroidery, appliqué in a hoop, and long-arming might be interested. It will be a 1-day class for groups of 3-4 people on each day, with different options to attend in April and May.

New Business

Hickory Landmarks Society will host local school kids at their annual <u>Heritage Days</u>, April 23-24 at Maple Grove House on Hwy. 127 in Hickory. Guild members will demonstrate quilting for the children, and Peggy Poe is signing up volunteers.

The <u>2020 Shop Hop dates</u> are June 13-20, on two Saturdays. Terri said 12 shops are participating this year, including 2 new ones, Sew Original (Boone, NC) and Sew Much Fun (Lowell, NC).

2020 Challenge: Barbara Mahnke and Jan Carpenter are co-chairing the guild's Challenge this year, with the theme of "Trees." Members may make any quilt inspired by or representing <u>anything related to a tree</u>, in any size or style, and using any technique. All entries

- There are still openings for Nancy Mahoney's "Chocolate Caramel Stars" (paper piecing) workshop on Saturday, <u>August 15</u>.

2021 Quilt Show

Kay Dwyer has reserved the Hickory Metro Convention Center for the next quilt show, Thursday, October 21 through Saturday, October 23, 2021. The guild and Klingspor will again share the convention center, which is very good news (thank you, Melissa Shaw!)

Kay announced that Mary Bucy will be her Co-Chair. They are already off and running, with the quilt show just 20 months away now. Kay handed out a complete list of Quilt Show Committees, including a job description for each. Details on a few committees were shared:

Mary Bucy is on the <u>Raffle Quilt Construction</u> Committee, chaired by Bonnie Gold. They plan to use the *Winter Village* pattern from Laundry Basket Quilts for the 2021 Raffle Quilt, a lovely blue and white quilt using batiks.

Mary said the <u>Raffle Quilt Sales</u> Committee's co-chairs need to be named soon, and asked for volunteers. The guild typically completes the Raffle Quilt in June of the prior year, so that various sales venues and opportunities can be organized after the quilt is completed.

Mary Bucy and Chris Appenzeller will chair the <u>Judging Committee</u>. Their members met and discussed the judging critique sheet, completed by the judges for each quilt and given to the quilt's maker. They would like for the judges to provide more information to the quilter, and asked members to use the survey forms provided to offer their own judging feedback.

Kay said a <u>quilt show theme</u> is still needed and she requested suggestions. She asked everyone to send their ideas to her, noting a suggestion was made to include "community" in the 2021 theme.

150th Anniversary Quilt

Hickory Mayor Hank Guess attended the January morning meeting and asked the guild to consider making a quilt to help celebrate the City of Hickory's 150th Anniversary during 2020. Debbie Swartzel shared the terrific plan for the quilt that quickly came together, based on a book Bonnie Gold had purchased. *That Town and Country Quilt* consists of 365 4-inch appliquéd blocks, which they tweaked (with the designer's permission) and downsized to only 160+ blocks. The quilt will include various Hickory features, historic industries, etc., with the City's 150th Anniversary logo in the center.

Debbie shared their plan for enlisting members in the process of making the individual blocks in two phases during February and March. Along with some helpers, they had already prepared and kitted individual blocks for members to choose from. She explained the process and distributed directions for making them, saying the Phase 1 blocks chosen tonight must be returned to the March meeting, and the Phase 2 blocks chosen by members in March must be returned in April. The entire quilt must be completed by early June, in time for the City's main

Personal projects were shared by (3) guild members.

Program

Guild member Gigi Miller presented a program on Pet Portraits. Clearly Gigi has been practicing her technique, learning new methods and tweaking her process along the way. She makes creating fabric portraits of family pets, kids, flowers, etc. from simple photos look fun and very interesting. Grace, the family's yellow lab, became her first "model," and her likeness (and very long tongue) has been captured in a variety of portraits. Another of her subjects was captured in portraits that ranged from sweet and simple, to Andy Warhol-ish in style.

Initially, Gigi took an on-line art quilt class from Leni Wiener and then picked up some ideas from Susan Brubaker Knapp's guild program a couple years ago, such as making a plastic overlay pattern, using Lite Steam a Seam, and adding thread painting. Next, Eve Agee's guild program on thread painting provided more good ideas, and she later borrowed a few ideas from Karen Ponischil's guild program last year. Gigi explained her process, and broke down the steps for making a pattern from her photo, noting that she has moved away from the plastic overlay pattern and now only uses tracing paper. One bit of advice when choosing a photo to use: simple is better.

When Gigi prepares the list of guild workshops for next year, she should add herself to the list. No doubt more than a few guild members would be interested in attending a more hands-on version of Pet Portraits, using their own personal photo. And if anyone doesn't really appreciate the resulting portrait, just tell them that "it's art."

There was an enthusiastic round of applause for Gigi's fun and motivating program, and Mary Long adjourned the meeting at 8:10 pm.


