Regarding collection of quilts during pandemic:

You will need to specify where you want the quilts to be placed.

Email or phone (email addresses and phone numbers can be obtained in the Guild directory) the person who is delivering the service project quilts to your chosen site and make arrangements with either Kathleen, Nancy, or Mary to arrange for drop-off.

A reminder that our Service Projects meet needs for a range of ages, birth to teens. We have added pillowcases and have been delivering them to Children's Advocacy and Family Guidance for a number of years. They were requested by the agencies because they are often used to hold possessions when a child is examined as well as a thoughtful place to lay their head during an exam. My editorial comment (Mary Long) is that we have such an opportunity to show compassion and care in so many ways!

Page 4 of the Guild Directory contains information about our Service Projects. For neonatal quilts, larger than the listed 36"x36" is acceptable according to NICU personnel.

Amanda Truett or Peggy McCosh will continue to handle Quilts of Valor.

When, and if we ever return to meeting as a Guild again, collections will resume at both the morning and evening meetings.
