Program

At Kay Dwyer's program on Scraps, Strips, and Selvedges, members draped their favorite scrap quilts on their chairs for others to admire. Kay began by discussing her 'addiction' to saving fabric scraps. She suggested (1) press scraps and if large enough, fold and separate by theme and color on shelves or clear plastic bins (2) store Batiks separately, then lights, bolds, and Modern prints. You should be able to see what you have. (3) Cut smaller pieces into strips, stored together for strip quilts, or cut in to a variety of square sizes and stored with like sizes. Crumbs, odd shapes, can be sewn together, then blocks can be cut from the resulting piece. *In all cases*, only keep the fabrics that 'speak' to

you. Share your scraps with another quilter. If you can, try to go through your stash twice a year and either make something from them or share.

Keep value in mind. Take a black/white photo and

Keep value in mind. Take a black/white photo and see value without be distracted by color. Schoolhouse Quilts sells a red and green filter that you can look through to see value as well.

Kay displayed many scrap projects. One a Yellow Brick Road design of squares and rectangles from larger pieces and dispersed around the quilt for balance. Kay pointed out that scrap quilts can be very 'busy.' White or neutral sashing can tone them down a bit.

Rope can be wound with thin strips of fabric and then sewn into bowls. English Paper Piecing has small geometric shapes that can use small pieces of fabric. This makes a nice portable project when traveling. Selvedges can be sewn onto fusible fleece and turned into zipper bags. Kay will demonstrate these techniques at her workshop later in April.
