Quilt Show Survey

The paragraph that follows is from Amanda Truett's minutes of the board meeting where Gail Meyer discussed results of the responses to the quilt show survey. [Look for an email with a new survey on the topic of judging.]

Seventy-two people responded to the quilt show survey. Interesting notes:

- Responses showed that food and printed show programs were the least important to the guild members.
- Proposal to have an online program (posted on the guild website) with a QR code for accessing at the sign-in.
- Judging fell in the middle of the range of priorities.

 Discussion on the expense versus experience of the professional judge. Kay Dwyer explained that a non-judged show would reduce both the volunteer labor and financial cost of a show. A viewer's choice would still give feedback from the guild and community with ribbons awarded at the end of the show or at the next guild meeting.
- With the smaller space, we also may not have as many categories.

FAMILY GUIDANCE CENTER CLOSURE


Change to information on page 6 of our 2024 Guild Directory which has all the information about our service projects and the organizations who receive quilt donations from us. One of these is Family Guidance Center which has been serving people in our community for 65 years. On August 9, 2024, the Center announced on their Facebook page that they would be closing their doors at the end of August 2024 due to falling revenue. This doesn't change the need for service projects which will continue to be taken to the remaining organizations.
