The past few years of quilt challenges. Of course, there was last year's Star Challenge and the Tree Challenge the year before.

Before those, there was the thought-provoking monthly Quilt Journal Challenge lead by Chris Appenzeller, where we were presented a theme and encouraged to do small 8" by 11" quilts following those themes. I remember the first one, for February was "love is. . ." We had some of the best discussions when the monthly themes were presented.

It can be a handwritten muslin label pinned to the quilt with your name. These quilts will be for display only and will not be judged.

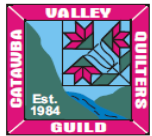
