

Exclusion from Care and Evidence of fit for normal attendance Policy

Purpose

Incident, injury, trauma and Illness are common childhood occurrences. The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all children in care are fit for normal attendance so that no one places themselves or others at risk of harm.

Implementation

The following policies and the exclusion periods are to be adhered to in relation to this policy.

- Accident and Illness prevention
- Acute Fever
- Diarrhoea and Vomiting
- Head Lice
- Incident, injury, Trauma and Illness
- Medical Conditions
- Immunisation staff and children
- Infectious and Notifiable disease

Incident, injury, trauma and Illness that occur outside of care

To ensure that every child including the child in question is not place at risk of harm, staff may request a written medical clearance that states a child is fit for normal attendance.

The Approved Provider/Director/Nominated Supervisor will ensure that this policy is maintained and implemented at all times.
