**Data:** Develop data infrastructure that supports both local continuous improvement and state-wide impact of C2C efforts.



**Policy & Advocacy:** Advocate at the local and state level for policies, resources, and implementation plans that meet the needs of youth and families.

### ECONOMIC EQUITY

Strengthen early education opportunities and resources while enhancing family and student-school connections through in and out-of-school support.



### HEALTH EQUITY

Expand culturally responsive medical and behavioral healthcare, school-based health centers, Community Health Workers, and Doula access.
