The most current definition of ABATE is American Bikers Aimed Toward Education. ABATE was originally founded by Lou Chimney of California. The concept has since spread across the nation. Most ABATE organizations are run on a state level with various chapters or regions participating therein.

HOW DOES ABATE ACCOMPLISH ITS GOALS?

ABATE of Florida, Inc. is a non-profit, grassroots political corporation composed of local chapters that have been organized by motorcyclists, to promote a positive image through local, civic, and charitable and benevolent causes; pooling resources for the common benefit of the members promoting political awareness. ABATE exists to monitor legislation and testifies in your behalf during Senate and House hearings. ABATE collects, processes, and exchanges information that may concern you or substantiate our views and places it in your hands through a newsletter or by other means.

WHO CAN JOIN?

Any individual 18 years of age or older interested in motorcycle rights, regardless of their sex, race or club affiliation. It does not matter if you ride or what you ride. ABATE ensures our option on motorcycle laws will be heard

We are a non-profit organization of motorcycle enthusiasts from all walks of life. We lobby and educate the government and the general public to promote motorcycling in a safe and positive image. We endeavor to enlist the cooperation and participation of all organizations and individuals that share a similar interest in preserving our American tradition of FREEDOM.

We promote motorcycle safety, training, & political awareness. WE ARE NOT A CLUB OR A GANG. We fund our work through toy runs, poker runs, camp outs, and other motorcycle activities. We are your neighbors & friends who work, pay taxes, and get involved with our community. We serve and support our country and believe in freedom. We use all legal means to protect our rights without infringing on the rights of others. ABATE of Florida, Inc. is incorporated under the laws of Florida as a motorcycle rights organization or "MRO". ABATE of Florida, Inc.

ABATE of Florida Accomplishments:

ABATE was the driving force behind the changes in Florida's Helmet Law. Florida Motorcyclists, over the age of 21 and who carry at least \$10,000 medical insurance coverage now enjoy the Freedom to Choose whether to wear a helmet or not. ABATE has developed & copyrighted "The Motorcycle Safety & Awareness Program" (MSAP). The program is presented to non-motorcyclists to educate them on how to safely share the road with motorcycles. It is taught in local schools & to civic organizations at no charge in the hope of reducing motorcycle accidents and deaths through education, not legislation.

- ABATE has gained a positive and respected position in Tallahassee. Because of our Lobbyist and Legislative efforts, State Representatives are aware of ABATE members and our vigilant quest.



Meet A Fellow Chapter Member



Richard King has been with ABATE since 2019 and is currently a member with South West Chapter.

MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) just did an article on Richard's time in the Marine Corps Service and teaching as a rider coach over the years. The full article can be read @ https://msf-usa.org/msf-news/ride-to-serve-serve-to-ride/ this also has full pictures of his time in the service.

Here is an excerpt from the article:

"I've enjoyed a lot of different bikes throughout the years. I've owned a Honda Gold Wing, a Ducati, a Kawasaki KLR650, a Kawasaki KLX, and several Harley-Davidsons (Sportster, Fat Boy, Road King — my current ride is a 2008 Ultra Classic). In the years since the military, I have made my career in commercial real estate. I now work from home, but when I had an office, I used to ride to work often. Motorcycling is my stress reliever. I especially enjoy long rides. I have ridden across the U.S. four times and from Florida to Sturgis, South Dakota, twice.

I love teaching others how to ride. I'm currently teaching MSF courses for the Motorcycle Training Institute Inc. at Rockstar Harley-Davidson in Fort Myers, Florida. There is no feeling like starting with someone who has never been on a bike, and within a few hours have them up and riding. When I tell students they have passed the course, the look on their faces is priceless.

For me, motorcycling has touched nearly every area of my life and has opened an entire community to me. Riders rock! Riders stop to help other riders who are stuck on the side of the road, and I'm no exception. I know a lot of motorcyclists and I can always be counted on for hosting or joining a group ride.

I'm often asked for advice from newer riders. I tell them to ride like they are invisible and never assume a driver sees them. I tell anyone thinking about riding to first take the MSF BRC. But don't stop there. Take the advanced MSF courses and periodically retake the BRC2. Riding is a lifestyle and a lifelong commitment to be constantly aware, to always be at the ready, to keep learning and growing, and to always be on your game.

Enjoy the ride — I hope to see you out there."

Pledge and Moment of Silence

PRESIDENTS REPORT: Griz- First business to address is the replacement of 2 Executive Board Members that have stepped down. Treasurer and Vice President. A couple of people have expressed interest in the VP position. Floor is open for Nominations.

Nominations for Vice President: Steve Kliemisch – Accepted. Alfie Fyock – Accepted. Shayne Hanley – Accepted. Vote was conducted by raising of sticks. S Kliemisch – 10, A Fyock – 8, S Hanley – 6. (3 Abstained) Steve Kliemisch if the new Vice President.

Nominations for Treasurer: Brandy Westerfield – Accepted. Bill Bird – Declined. No other nominations. Brandy Westerfield is the new Treasurer.

A new Legislative Trustee has been appointed – Bob Contoro. Thank you to all that stepped up.

PR – I've sent the info to many magazines. Brandy – Can you send out your list? * Question was asked from Forest about the 501c3 and how it was transferred from Doc Fish to Doc R. – it is being worked on at this time. There is a letter to Jerry T but it is on hold for right now. Explained how extremely helpful Doc has been with our legislative pursuit and how he has worked behind the scenes with Rich.

SAFETY TRUSTEE: Russ – Thank you for your vote of confidence at the last meeting.

- 1. . I've completed the concept letter and other items for FDOT grant submission. Without a 501(c)3, I was not able to submit it by the February 28th deadline. I will attempt it again for next year once we do have our non-profit corporation.
- 2. . Since ABATE Safety and Education, Inc. refuses to release funds specifically intended for ABATE of Florid Inc., we are in dire need for safety products. Let's hope our safety money bills pass. Have you called your representatives?
- 3. . Make sure any safety booth presentation forms are completed correctly and are sent to State within business days.
- 4. . I need a list from all Chapters of their certified MSAP Course Instructors ASAP please. The more certific instructors we have in each chapter, the better.
- 5. . Safety Booth Presentations. Were discussed and stressed that anyone can setup the Presentation, but plea document it and send pictures.
- 6. . MSAP Discussed the process of becoming certified and talked about having certification classes at the ne Delegate Meeting. Lana offered to help with training. Estero what kind of documentation do we need for MSAP? Forest I have been an instructor and if you schedule a class let me know. We have an upcoming class if you want to join us. We have many people who might be able to join. SE If you were certified 4 years are you still certified? Discussed issues with lapsed certifications.

Bob talked about things we are doing tomorrow: shirts, drip pans and trophies. This day tomorrow is to "make friends".

LOBBYIST: Rich - The only reason we are where we are is because of ABATE. Doc has been nothing but helpful to me. Know who your Reps are for tomorrow. Address the staff in their office and thank them for supporting the "Motorcycle" bill. SB 838 or HB 709 is what will be addressing. Explained the Representatives and Senators that have helped with the advancement of this bill. Rich also discussed and explained the Insurance Tort reform just as an FYI. Russ read the HB 709 and explanations were given on the changes including the removal of the name of ABATE. This could be beneficial because the new qualification has guidelines that ABATE meets. Only 2-3 Non-Profits will meet these qualifications. *Big reminder that the DOT members will be fighting to keep this money in their budget, but do not have a Lobbyist right now. Big shout out to Sen. McClain in helping us get the bill heard in its 1st committee.
