Squeezed in between those events was the WMLA Annual meeting, Silent Auction, with the Phil Siehr 3 Person Team shoot. Thanks to everyone for making those events very successful. More about those events later in my article. Oh, and I almost forgot, my trip to Kansas for a long weekend to celebrate one of my grandchildren's First Holy Communion.



## As Always-- Keep Your Powder Dry

Black powder was invented and has been used by the Chinese since the 9th century AD. The function of black powder (and all its types and varieties) is to go boom. It is a propellant. It is supposed to burn (at the right rate) under controlled conditions to propel the ball out of your muzzle loader. Actually as the powder burns, the gasses expand, pushing the ball out of the barrel. It is interesting that black powder burns instantaneously when ignited.

Prior to industrialization in the 1800s, black powder was made by combining powdered potassium nitrate (also called saltpeter) with powdered charcoal and powdered sulfur. The saltpeter provides oxygen for the chemical reaction in firing. Charcoal provides the fuel. Sulfur helps stabilize the reaction. It is still basically made the same way.

The standard ratio by weight was 75:15:10, and that is still is the standard. This combining is sometimes called green meal and can include coarse pieces and lumps. To use it at this stage it is questionable and can be dangerous. For optimum quality, the combined powders need to be "fine" and uniform... basically, the stuff needed to be homogenized or milled. It was then pressed into disks or cakes (called mill cakes). The cake is then crushed and sifted into different grains for use.

With industrialization, the making and mixing of black powder is a lot easier and effective. However, in some places, it is still made by hand. If it is not stored properly, black powder degrades over time. It is interesting that historically, willow was the sought after wood for making black powder charcoal. [I'll cover the making of charcoal in my next article.] Note: If you are making charcoal at home, do not grate or powder your charcoal—for black powder in your kitchen, or use your wife's blender.

Smokeless powder was "invented" in 1884 by the French chemist, Paul Vieillé. He called it "poudre blanche" (white powder as opposed to black powder). It was made with insoluble and soluble nitrocellulose, that is gelatinized with ether and paraffin. The recipe has been tweaked several times since then, including adding nitroglycerin to some varieties. Because the recipe has changed, the powder is no longer white.

Smokeless powder is called that because it smokes less than black powder... but it does smoke. As the use of smokeless powder has increased, the use of black powder has decreased to a point.

Because of the higher pressure of smokeless powder, it is NOT recommended for use in muzzle loading. The <u>only</u> exception involves those modern muzzle loaders specifically designed to use smokeless powder. Black powder substitutes are <u>allegedly</u> safer, less corrosive, more efficient, and less fouling (easier to clean up after). Three of the most popular brands are: Pyrodex, Triple Seven, and Blackhorn 209. Besides potassium nitrate, charcoal, and sulfur (only 60% of a mix of the three)-- potassium perchlorate, sodium benzoate, dicyandiamide, dextrin, and water are added to make Pyrodex. The other brands have similar additives.

Whatever you use... Keep your powder dry.

A wild turkey: a Tom, was harvested on May 1, 2024 by Richard Mezera of Montello, Wisconsin and witnessed by Andrea Bulgrin. The turkey weighed 22.5 pounds. It had a 10 inch beard and 1 inch spurs. Richard's turkey had a total measurement of 62.5 points. Richard harvested the turkey around 6:30 a.m. at a distance of 18 yards using a Navy Arms 12 gauge double barrel muzzle loading shotgun. Congratulations to Richard Mezera and Thank you for entering the 2024 W.M.L.A Spring Turkey, Big Game Awards Program.

A wild turkey: a Tom, was harvested on May 1, 2024 by Jerry Gosda of Janesville, Wisconsin. Jerry harvested the turkey in Adams Co. Wisconsin and was witnessed by Mike Anderson and Rick Stanton. The turkey weighed 26-3/4 pounds with a 11-1/4 inch beard. One spur was 1-1/8 inches long and the other spur was 1-3/16 inches long. The total score was 74.8 125 points. Jerry harvested the turkey using a muzzle loading 12 gauge double barrel shotgun with one shot at a distance of 30 yards. With that score, it moves Jerry Gosda into second place in the W.M.L.A. Big Game Awards Wild Turkey Record Book. Congratulations to Jerry Gosda on your accomplishment and Thank you for entering the 2024 Spring Turkey W.M.L.A Big Game Awards Program.

A Whitetail Deer was harvested by Ray Brown of Milton, Wisconsin. Ray harvested the 8 point buck on Saturday November 23, 2024 in Iowa County. Charlie Brown was a witness to the harvest. The whitetail buck had an estimated score of 72-1/4 points. Ray harvested the deer using a 50 caliber percussion Hawken rifle, a 150 grain Buffalo Bullet and 50 grains of 3f black powder. He made a 30 yard shot with not tracking. Congratulations to Ray Brown on his accomplishment and Thank you Ray for entering the 2024 Whitetail Deer W.M.L.A. Big Game Awards Program.

Jim Nosker from Colfax, Wisconsin harvested a whitetail doe on November 27, 2024 and witnessed by Sydney Tanner. The doe was taken with a .54 caliber patched round ball, driven by 110 grains of FFG Triple 7 powder from a Thompson Center percussion Hawken rifle. The distance was 63 yards and the ball passed through the chest, destroying both lungs.

Jim Nosker from Colfax, Wisconsin harvested a whitetail buck on December 11, 2024 and witnessed by Sidney Tanner. The buck was killed with a saboted .44 caliber Hornady bullet fired from a .50 caliber Traditions inline, using two 50 grain pellets of Triple 7 powder. The buck had both lungs destroyed with a pass-through shot and the distance was 24 yards. Jim stated that the buck had one horn broken off so no need for scoring. Congratulations to Jim Nosker on his accomplishments and Thank you Jim for entering the 2024 Whitetail Deer W.M.L.A. Big Game Awards Program.

# Program Guidelines

Wild Turkey

- 1. All entrants shall be members in good standing of the Wisconsin Muzzle Loader Association. Do not have to be a member at time of kill, must become a member before apply in the award program.
- 2. All game must be harvested in MEMBERS HOME STATE during the established legal season and be taken using a muzzleloader approved by the Department of Natural Resources, following good sportsmanship and fair chase practices.
- 3. A plaque shall be awarded at the WMLA Annual Membership Meeting to the entrant who establishes a new record or exceeds a WMLA state record for each category.
- 4. In addition to the plaque, members who establish a new, or exceed a previously established record in either the deer or bear categories, shall have a donation of \$50.00 in his/her name made to a conservation oriented, non-profit organization operating in Wisconsin.
- 5. The top entrant in all categories, not establishing a new record or exceeding a previously established state record, shall be recognized at the WMLA Annual Members Meeting with a framed certificate.
- 6. All entrants shall receive WMLA Big Game Award pins.
- 7. Antlerless deer qualify for WMLA Big Game Award pins.

# Scoring Procedure

- 1. Scoring for whitetail deer and bear shall follow the Boone and Crockett Scoring System.
- 2. Scoring for wild turkey shall follow the National Wild Turkey Federation Scoring System. (Field dressed weight, plus two times the beard length, plus ten times the combiner length of both spurs.)
- 3. Scoring for Canada goose shall be body weight at time of harvest.

# Entry Procedure

- 1. Entrants shall fill out and mail the entry from, available in the Badger State Muzzleloader, along with \$5.00 entry fee, or otherwise notify the Hunting Committee Chairperson of their intent to enter, within 60 days of the close of that particular season.
- 2. Upon receipt of the completed entry form and one picture of the big game entry and payment of \$5.00 entry fee, the committee shall: \* Forward the applicant the procedures for scoring their entry, and a WMLA Big Game Award pin.


