

SUSTAINABILITY REPORTS 2016/17

This year we again focused primarily on refugees as the challenges displaced people face remain as severe as ever. We supported with funds the following organisations:



MSF needs no introduction as being one of the foremost agencies working in war torn environments meeting the needs of those desperate and unwittingly caught up in conflicts.



Help Refugees is the leading UK NGO in a new movement of humanitarian aid. Acting where governmental and other non-governmental bodies are unable to, we are working to fill the huge and terrifying gaps in services for those displaced by war in Europe and beyond. With no bureaucracy and minimal overheads, every pound we raise can be traced to its tangible impact on the ground.

Leeds Asylum Seekers' Support Network

LASSN works in Leeds to ensure asylum seekers and refugees feel supported, empowered and integrated, settled and safe. They do incredible work on the ground and we have been very pleased to be able to support their work.

The Mountain Way is a small charity devoted to supporting veterans suffering from PTSD with tailored personal programmes designed specifically to help them through this debilitating experience in their lives.



Chance against cancer is a charity caring for children with cancer based in Beirut. Because NO child should be denied the right to be cured for lack of financial means, CHANCE was founded in 2002 by doctors, parents & volunteers so that EVERY child in Lebanon can receive the best CHANCE to be saved.

We also offset our carbon footprint with a donation to Rainforest Concern. While the need to offset is unfortunate it remains the most effective method of making us think about our carbon footprint. In 2016/2017 the footprint has been considerably less than before.



We have also made sundry small payments to a number of charities on a monthly or quarterly basis through CAF.

In addition, we completed training and mentoring at no cost or highly subsidised as follows:

- 9 days, made up of 32 separate occasions, of mentoring to those who could not pay
- 4 days of subsidised training to the States of Guernsey
- 28 days of subsidised training for the NHS
- 5 days of free consultancy to Gipsil, a Leeds based charity dealing with vulnerable young people from age 4 to 24
