# **Commitment and Expectations**

### Schedule At A Glance

### Off-season (May – December):

- An exhilarating phase, this is when we actualize our robot designs post the competition announcement.
- Commit to at least 8 hours weekly.
- Typical meetings: Mondays (5:00 8:00 pm), Fridays (5:00 9:00 pm), and Saturdays (10:00 5:30 pm).

## Competition Season:

- We usually partake in two regional events from late February to early April.
- If qualified and funded, we aim for the FIRST World Championship in Houston, Texas, in late April.
