It was very hard on me and my siblings growing up without our mother and father in our presence. The time spent with my mother was a lifetime full of happiness and unforgettable moments. Everyday I wish I could go back to the best 9 years that she was in my life. My mother showed me a different and unique kind of love and happiness no one could ever. My mother was my whole world, I never left her side, everywhere she went I would go. My mother made me feel so special that I never wanted to leave her presence. Me being so young when this happened and not knowing what was really going on, my world felt like it was turned upside down when she left. All of my happiness was taken away from me. My mother is an amazing person, heart full of love and peace. My mother has always been a giving and very joyful person. She always did what she could to help others even if she didn't know them or it didn't benefit her. My mother was always willing to help anyone in any possible way she could. Even while being incarcerated, My mother still to this day does everything she can to help me and my siblings live a better life. My mother has done more than anybody has ever done for me. She has guided me and helped me the best she could. She has put food in my mouth, clothes on my back, made sure I went to school and did what I was supposed to and with everything I needed. All from a prison cell. No my mother is not perfect but she is a great person and a wonderful mother. She acknowledges and takes responsibility for her mistakes and wrong doings and will do the best she can to make things right. Prison has made my mother very sick and weak over the years. She tries her best to be the happiest she can be but her sickness takes over some days. Although my mother had heart conditions before going to prison, she was still very strong and healthy. My mother's heart condition and health is getting worse by the day, due to her not receiving the proper care she needed at the time, she has now developed more serious health issues. My mother is now facing body infections, she has become very ill from the mold in the prison, she has to depend on a walker to move around, suffering an infection in her right ear that has affected her hearing abilities. Her conditions are only getting worse and weakening her health. My mother doesn't even look the same any more. You can look at her and tell she's sick, suffering and unhealthy. My mother still till this day hasn't received the proper medical care she has been needing for a very long period of time, even doctors have told her she needs to get out of prison and get the proper medical care she has been needing before things get even worse to the point where there's nothing left to be done to help her conditions. I don't want my mother to die in prison. So I ask that please show her and her family some sympathy in deciding her release. She has completed more than 75 percent of her sentence, she has not got into any trouble during the years of her being incarcerated. My mother has a family that's willing to help her with finances, get a house, help her with securing a good stable job, and help her with anything she needs in order to live a positive lifestyle. She has 3 grandchildren that need her the age (3 finna be 4) and (1 finna be 2)my mother has missed out on a lot so please help us bring her home
