When members of the church refuse to repent of such an ungodly attitude, they need to realize that they could indeed be subject to church discipline and withdrawal of fellowship (2<sup>nd</sup> Thessalonians 3:6, 14-15).

The Bible is filled with verses which teach us to be very careful and wise in our speech (and yet we all make dreadful mistakes in this area). Hear the word of the Lord! "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers" (Ephesians 4:29). "And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you" (Ephesians 4:32). "Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings, as newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, thay ye may grow thereby" (1st Peter 2:1-2). "Let brotherly love continue" (Hebrews 13:1). "Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones" (Proverbs 16:24).

Brethren, we all need to be wise with our words and we very much need to season our speech with salt!



The room, the light, the pulpit, all spoke of wondrous peace;


But how could one commune with God, unless the talking ceased?

## Finding Time for the Bible

## **God's Wonderful Creation**

As spring begins to take shape, one should take the time to notice the beauty that surrounds us, and come to realize that it all came from God. This means that the only way we can know about the creation is from God who did the creating. Genesis 1:1 states: "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth." Everything was created by the power of God. The first thing God did was to create light and in Genesis 1:4-5: "And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness. And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day." All six days of creation had both an evening and a morning, just like the days do today. These six days of creation were literal 24-hour days, not billions of years as some falsely claim.

God told Moses as it is recorded in Exodus 20:11 "For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them." God said that everything He created was created in these six days of creation. There was not a progressive creation spread out over billions of years.

In Genesis 1:24 we read "And God said, let the earth bring forth the living creature according to its kind: cattle and creeping thing and beast of the earth, each according to its kind; and it was so." God is so powerful that all He has to do is to speak and it happens. Each produces after its own kind. There is no evolution from one kind to another because God said that each was to produce "according to its kind."

The following is stated in Genesis 1:27 and 2:7: "So God created man in His own image; in the image of God created He him; male and female created He them...and man became a living soul." We are created in the image of God—this is what makes us so special. Everyone has a soul that will live on forever in eternity—either in Heaven or in Hell. Listen to the words of the psalmist: "Let all the earth fear the Lord: let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him. For He spake, and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast." (Psalm 33:8-9).
