Evidence of His Handiwork: Bees Outsmart Scientists

Scientists have long recognized that bees are intelligent creatures. Many believe that this intelligence is the product of millions of years of natural selection. But the extremely fast learning ability of the bee puts in doubt the millions of years and instead shows the hand of the Creator.

Researchers at Princeton University decided to find out whether bees were smart enough to find their food source if it was moved. The researchers moved the prime food source fifty meters farther from the hive. It took the bees less than one minute to locate the moved food source. The men then moved the food source another fifty meters away. The bees still took less than a minute to find the food source.

However, the bees had also been studying the researchers. Before the researchers could move the food another fifty meters, they found the bees had discovered the pattern and were already waiting at the new location!

In Times of Stress

In Psalms 56, we read David's words during a time of extreme stress. There came a time when the young warrior was captured by the Philistines in the area of Gath. You will recall that David defeated and killed the Philistines' beloved warrior, Goliath, in battle (1 Samuel 17). Goliath's hometown was Gath. You can imagine that this was a place where David was most hated. David gives us an idea of how dangerous this area was to him: It was there that David was being hunted down (Psalms 56:1-2); David's enemies were spreading lies about him (Psalms 56:5); and they were constantly planning and scheming to destroy David (Psalms 56:6).

In the midst of all this stress and fear, David makes this amazing declaration of faith: "When I am afraid, I put my trust in You ..." and "... in God I trust and am not afraid. What can man do to me?" (Psalms 56:3,11).

David knew that by actively choosing to trust in God, one can overcome fear and find peace even amidst the most difficult circumstances. So, whenever you are feeling anxious or threatened, turn to prayer and trust in God's protection.

Did You Know This About Esther?

God is not mentioned a single time in the book of Esther. This has led some people to claim the book should not be included in the Bible.

However, there are a few good reasons to know that God is deeply involved in the events of this book.

First, Mordecai told Esther that if she chose not to help save the Israelites, "relief and deliverance" would come to the Jewish people from another place (Esther 4:14). Mordecai knew God was working to return His people to Jerusalem, just as He had promised.

Second, Mordecai continues by appealing to God's providential work when he said, "Yet who knows whether you have come to the kingdom or such a time as this?"

Finally, Esther told the people to fast for her for three days and nights. What would that accomplish, if the fast was not focused on prayer and requests for God's intervention?
