Independence Day

A couple of days ago, our nation celebrated Independence Day (July the 4th). It is a time when we remember the sacrifices that our nation's fathers made to win the freedoms we enjoy, today.

Beekeepers know that a bee's age is determined by the condition of its wings. Because bees constantly work, their wings get a lot of wear and tear. Young bees have wide, well-formed wings, whereas older bees have narrow, torn, and tattered wings.

The bee does not die of old age. It dies when its wings are completely worn out and it can no longer work or fly. Near the point of death, the bee points itself away from the beehive and begins to fly, never to return again. The bee literally wears itself out working!

There is a spiritual lesson here for us. As Christians, we must be diligent servants, doing the work of the Lord. When Jesus evaluated the spiritual condition of the seven churches of Asia (Rev. 2-3), their degree of acceptance was directly proportional to the kind and amount of work they were doing.

The inspired writer James, "But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed" (James 1:25).

Let us be people who are willing to "work our wings off" in the Lord's service.

Christ is the Center, Focus, and Key

Christ is the center, focus, and key to the inspiration and interpretation of the Bible. This is why the books of the Old and New Testaments fit together so well into one cohesive and comprehensive whole. Taken together, they present the progressive unfolding, revelation, and communication of Christ.

- **1. The Law (Genesis-Deuteronomy)** prepares the ground or base on which the moral system of Christ rests. It is the beginning or first principles of the system of truth.
- **2. The History section (Joshua-Esther)** shows the preparation for Christ. History, from an inerrant biblical perspective, holds true the necessity of righteousness and faith.
- **3. Poetry (Job-Song of Solomon)** expresses an aspiration for Christ the Savior. Seeing that Scripture is nothing less than the words of our very Creator, it is no wonder that throughout the centuries men and women have been astonished by it.
- **4. Prophecy (Isaiah-Malachi)** proclaims an expectation of Christ. The Bible is the account of redemption, how God rescues men from sin and from death.
- **5. The Gospel Records (Matthew-John)** relate the historical manifestation of Christ. They are true accounts of the work and the acts of Christ the Son of God.
- **6. Acts** relates the propagation of the gospel of Christ. It portrays the resurrected Christ in His ascension, by the Spirit, through the disciples, for the producing of the church the kingdom of God.

- **7. The Epistles (Romans-Jude)** give the interpretation of Christ. The epistles answer questions asked by the church or address problems within the church.
- **8. Revelation** describes the consummation of all things in Christ. The second coming of Christ marks the time when the church goes home for eternity.

How is it that every part of the Bible, in spite of its great diversity, can contribute to its overarching theme of redemption and its central figure, the Christ?

How? Because it is from God!

Did You Know This About Lamentations?

Jeremiah, the writer of Lamentations, was known as the "Weeping Prophet." This book expresses deep grief over the destruction of Jerusalem in 586 BC by the Babylonians.

Lamentations consists of five poems, each one laid out in acrostic fashion. Jeremiah begins each poem with the first letter of the Hebrew alphabet, and works through each of the 22 letters.

Even in the midst of crying over Jerusalem, a key verse in Lamentations exclaims,

"Through the Lord's mercies we are not consumed, Because His compassions fail not.

They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness.

"The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "Therefore I hope in Him!" (Lam. 3:22-24).
