Alumni in Recovery (AinR) is a platform for local young people in recovery and parents who have lost their children to overdose deaths, speaking openly about addiction and recovery in a peer-to-peer approach.

Alumni in Recovery is providing to schools, at no cost, videos of our members sharing their stories of recovery and loss Sharing this with others is in hopes of making a difference how we perceive addiction as a disease process.

AinR created these videos for school use during the pandemic and COVID-limited gatherings. They can be useful in a number of ways such as classroom or home assignments. Addiction is a family disease, so it is powerful to include parents as part of the conversation about addiction through AinR videos. By providing honest information regarding addiction into family's homes, it becomes a restorative practice - a collaborative learning medium through the lens of people that speak from the heart.
