Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Paris today.

Paris → 3 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Paris

Included meals: welcome dinner

Bonne arrivée! After clearing arrivals, transfer from the airport to your hotel to recharge. This evening, join your fellow travelers at a local restaurant for a welcome dinner, served with beer or wine, and let your first impression of Paris leave you enchanter.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Paris & Versailles Palace

Included meals: breakfast

Ready to be dazzled by the City of Light? Follow a local guide on a sightseeing tour to get an overview of its most recognizable landmarks and a feel for the character of its arrondissements. (That's French for "districts," and it's how Parisians refer to the city's neighborhoods.)

- Drive down the sycamore-lined Avenue des Champs-Elysées and take in the magnificent Arc de Triomphe, originally built to commemorate one of Napoleon's many conquests. A dozen different avenues spoke from this epic arch, making it Paris' symbolic heart.
- Pass the 16th-century Pont Neuf, the oldest stone bridge in Paris, and Notre-Dame Cathedral. Watching over its arrondissement from an island in the Seine River, this French Gothic masterwork is a veritable icon.
- Stop for a photo at the Eiffel Tower (you know this one!) before viewing the Palais Garnier opera house and the Place de la Concorde, the city's grandest square.
- Pass by the I.M. Pei-designed Louvre Pyramid—the grandiose glass gateway to the world's preeminent art museum.
- Marvel at the Hotel des Invalides: Erected in

the 17th century and built to a height of roughly 350 feet, this gold-domed structure is the largest church building in Paris and serves as the final resting place of its greatest military leaders.

This afternoon, travel outside of Paris to the opulent Palace of Versailles, a transformation from a modest hunting lodge to the most magnificent château in France, envied by royalty across the globe.

- Marvel at the grandeur of the palace as you tour the State Apartments, where the lavish decor and intricate details will transport you back to the days of Louis XIV. The highlight of your visit will undoubtedly be the glittering Hall of Mirrors, where history was made and treaties were signed amidst the dazzling reflections of crystal chandeliers and gilded statues.
- Wander through the expansive gardens, designed by the renowned landscape architect André Le Nôtre. As you stroll along the manicured paths, you'll encounter exquisite statues, splendid fountains, and vibrant flowerbeds that create a picturesque and serene atmosphere. Each corner of the garden offers a new delight, from the musical fountains to the hidden groves.

Day 4: Chantilly Plant Days

Included meals: breakfast

Spend your day wandering through the renowned Chantilly Plant Days, where botanical splendor meets artistic excellence in a feast for the senses. As you explore the show's meticulously designed thematic gardens, you'll encounter rare and collectible plant specimens that even experienced gardeners rarely have the opportunity to admire. Take time to appreciate the artistic craftsmanship on display throughout the grounds, where horticultural design transforms into living art against the backdrop of one of France's most elegant estates.

Rouen → 3 nights

Day 5: Rouen via Chateau La Roche-Guyon & Giverny

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Journey west toward Rouen today, discovering two treasured gems of the Normandy region along the scenic route. Your day unfolds with architectural wonders carved into cliffs and the gardens that inspired Impressionist masterpieces, giving you a glimpse into France's artistic and historical legacy.

- Arrive at Chateau La Roche-Guyon, an extraordinary fortress dramatically carved into the limestone cliffs overlooking the Seine River, where centuries of French history come alive through its unique architecture.
- Follow your guide through the château's historic interiors and ascend through terraced gardens that climb the hillside, offering sweeping panoramic views of the Seine Valley below.
- Continue your artistic pilgrimage to Giverny, where Claude Monet created his most beloved paintings, and embark on a sightseeing tour of his colorful house where the master painter lived and worked.
- Wander through the enchanting gardens that inspired Monet's water lily series, crossing the iconic Japanese bridge and marveling at the reflecting ponds that appear in countless Impressionist masterpieces.
- Enjoy free time to explore Giverny at your own pace, with the opportunity to savor lunch at one of the local cafés or bistros either before or after your garden exploration.

After your day of exploration, you'll continue to your hotel in Rouen where you'll get checked in into your accommodations. Once refreshed, reconvene with your fellow travelers for tonight's included dinner.

Day 6: Jardin Le Vasterival, Le Bois des Moutiers & Chateau de Miromesnil

Included meals: breakfast

Immerse yourself in Normandy's horticultural treasures as you explore three distinctive gardens, each showcasing a different vision of landscape design. From wild and naturalistic plantings to formal Arts and Crafts precision and historic chateau grounds, today's journey reveals the artistic soul of French garden traditions.

- Visit the enchanting Jardin Le Vasterival, where Princess Greta Sturdza transformed 30 acres of wild thicket into a magical undergrowth that changes with each season.

- Follow your guide through Le Vasterival's winding paths, discovering how shapes, colors, and scents from more than 7,000 species and varieties of plants blend together in perpetual, harmonious change.
- Continue to Le Bois des Moutiers, where celebrated gardens designed in the Arts and Crafts style create a perfect harmony between architecture and landscape.
- Wander amid vibrant rhododendrons and rare plantings as your guide reveals the garden's secrets, pausing occasionally to admire sweeping views toward the sea that frame this botanical masterpiece.
- Arrive at the stately Chateau de Miromesnil, a magnificent 16th-century Norman château perhaps most famous as the birthplace of renowned writer Guy de Maupassant.
- Explore the château's historic rooms filled with period furniture and artwork before strolling through its peaceful walled garden and park, where centuries of careful cultivation create a tranquil backdrop to this architectural treasure.

Day 7: Le Jardin Plume & Lyons-la-Forêt

Included meals: breakfast

Spend your third day exploring more of the picturesque countryside of Normandy, discovering both innovative garden design and one of France's most enchanting medieval villages. Today's journey reveals the region's unique blend of natural beauty and historic charm, showcasing why Normandy has captivated visitors for centuries.

- Start at Le Jardin Plume, an internationally acclaimed contemporary garden where geometric precision meets naturalistic planting in a poetic dance of form and freedom.
- Wander through the garden's distinctive "rooms" where ornamental grasses sway like feathers (plumes) in the breeze, creating a mesmerizing tapestry of texture and movement against meticulously clipped hedges.
- Continue to the enchanting village of Lyons-la-Forêt, where your Tour Director will guide you through cobblestone streets lined with half-timbered houses and picturesque squares that have inspired countless artists and writers through the centuries.

- Enjoy free time to explore this medieval gem at your own pace, perhaps visiting the historic covered market hall dating from the 18th century or simply relaxing at a local café to absorb the tranquil atmosphere.

Normandy Region → 2 nights

Day 8: Normandy Region via Les Jardins d'Etretat, Honfleur & calvados tasting

Sit down for an included dinner this evening, served with beer or wine.

Day 9: Gardens of Normandy

- Conclude your horticultural journey at the Jardin des Plantes in Caen, an expansive botanical garden and arboretum showcasing over 8,000 plant species across verdant alleys and specialized greenhouses. Discover collections that blend native Normandy flora with exotic specimens, creating a living museum of botanical diversity.

Loire Valley → 4 nights

Day 10: Loire Valley via Jardin du Pays d'Auge & Maison du Camembert

Included meals: breakfast, tasting, dinner
Turn inland toward the majestic Loire Valley today, pausing along the way to explore Normandy's pastoral beauty and culinary heritage.

The domain features several cafés

where you can stop for lunch or a coffee break during your visit. Today, explore the renowned International Garden Festival at Domaine de Chaumont-sur-Loire, a prestigious annual event where landscape design meets artistic expression and innovation takes root in carefully crafted garden installations.

- Begin with a guided tour through this year's festival gardens, where designers and botanists from around the world showcase creative installations interpreting the annual theme.
- Learn from your expert guide about the concepts, techniques, and stories behind these living artworks, discovering details and design elements you might otherwise miss.
- Enjoy free time after the tour to revisit gardens that particularly captured your imagination or explore those you haven't yet seen at your own pace.

Day 13: Chateau de Villandry

Visit Château de Villandry today, a Renaissance château celebrated for having the most spectacular ornamental kitchen gardens in France.

- Discover the famous ornamental kitchen garden, where vibrant vegetables are arranged in geometric patterns that blend practicality with artistry, creating a living tapestry of color and form.
- Wander through the formal ornamental gardens with their intricate box hedges shaped into symbols of love—from tender hearts to passionate flames—designed to represent different aspects of romance.
- Admire the water garden's serene reflecting pools and the sun garden's Mediterranean-inspired terraces, where carefully orchestrated plantings create distinct atmospheres across multiple garden levels.

The evening is yours to explore at your leisure.

Day 14: Paris via Chartres & evening Seine river cruise

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner

Bid farewell to the Loire Valley this morning as you journey back toward the City of Light for your final night in France. Along the way, make a memorable stop in the medieval city of Chartres, home to the magnificent Chartres Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the finest examples of French Gothic architecture in existence.

Take in the nighttime allure of the City of Light for a special final evening in Paris. The event begins with a celebratory farewell dinner at a local restaurant. After you dine, board a boat cruise along the Seine. As you coast along the river and under Paris' bridges, you'll behold the illuminated monuments of the city glittering alongside the riverbanks.

Please note: The dress code may vary depending on the restaurant for your dinner. Your Tour Director will advise you on what to wear, but shorts and sneakers are likely to be considered inappropriate attire.
