### How to find your local Habitat for Humanity organization

### Go to Habitat.org

On the home page there is a box where you can enter your zip code and it will provide you with the email and phone number for your local organization.

# Some examples of physical activities where the club could partner with Habitat for Humanity

Assist the new owner with designing some or all of their new yard

Provide of all or part of the front garden with plants

working with new owner to design the bed (s)

provide education of how to care for plants

purchase, from club funds, some or all of the plants

Provide club member assistance to plant one of more planting bed

Have club members, working with owner, assist in planting

Donate time to actually build the structure

### What types of donations are available

Donate to national Habitat for Humanity

Donate to local Habitat for Humanity organization

(Note: once monies are donated directly to the national or local organization you cannot earmark a specific item or activity)

Donation of buying some plants, top soil, mulch, etc. can be allocated by the garden club to a specific owner once building is completed.

# Interaction with local Habitat for Humanity contact

As you work with your local Habitat for Humanity contact be clear that whatever you do is only if the club has available funds (for the plants, etc.) and/or available time.

A note of caution: As there are occasions where more than one club is in the same local Habitat for Humanity catchment area, be careful to not provide assistance out of your own club's catchment area.
