HORT TIPS FOR FALL from Marge Eberz



Lawn Care

Plant new lawn areas, overseed, aerate and fertilize the lawn **Gardening Tasks**

Evaluate the garden successes and failures

What needs to be moved or divided? Divide spring- and summer-blooming perennials.

Remove annuals

Get rid of diseased foliage

After first frost kills leaves, dig up tender bulbs for example:

Cannas, caladiums, dahlias. Store where they will not freeze

Cut back perennials, but leave perennials with seed heads for birds

Coneflowers, for example

Do not cut back these perennials

Evergreen/semi evergreen

Dianthus, Heucherella, foam flower, ajuga, creeping Phlox, Red Hot Poker

Woody Stem

Hibiscus, Russian Sage, Lavender, Butterfly bush

Winter-Interest Perennials

Hellebores, ornamental grasses, sedum, allium

Do not prune spring-blooming shrubs or trees

Bring houseplants back inside before the temperature drops, being sure to wash them off first to get rid of insects

Clean all gardening tools before putting them away

Planting: Try something new!

Bulbs in drifts of 25 or more for effect
