Winter Hort. Tips from Marge

A Gardner's Checklist for 2023

- 1. Are there any areas on your property where perennials are needed?
- 2. Select a calendar for scheduling garden tasks and when plants have bloomed.
- 3. Does your landscape lack plants with winter interest? If so, consider planting some this spring.
- 4. Consider adding more native plants to your beds.
- 5. Continuing feeding birds and provide them with water.
- 6. Plan your summer containers utilizing small, less expensive natives.
- 7. Place evergreen branches over emerging bulbs and perennials to keep them from being eaten by animals.
- 8. New Plants being introduced this year and in gardening centers this spring to add to your garden:
